Council Grants Extra License After Changing Ordinance Limiting Number To Two.

There had already been two licenses granted, and Beckett seemed to have arrived too late. Still, he is resourceful, and he lingered in the county seat until the council held a special meeting and changed the scheme of granting licenses, so that it now stands in such shape that three saloons can be operated. The new system allows one saloon for every 500 inhabitants.
