Cook House of Newcastle Coal Company, Catching Inlet, Burned Down.

THREATENING FIRE IN LOGGING CAMP

Entire Force of Workmen Is Called Into Service to Fight the Timber Blaze.

A timber fire started yesterday afternoon in the Boutin logging camp at Beaver Hill, and was at first given little attention. The flames soon made it evident that something should be done to stay their progress, and the entire force of workmen was called out to fight the fire. Several cabins were afire at times and considerable timber was burned before the fighters succeeded in extinguishing the flames. None of the cabins was burned, as the fire in these was put out as soon as discovered. It appeared at one time as if the fire would get beyond control of the men who were fighting it. The fire was started by sparks from a donkey engine.

UNION MEN WILL NOT MARCH.

Chicago Labor Organizations Will Abandon Annual Parade.

Chicago, July 26.—Chicago has seen the last of its Labor Day parades, at least for several years to come. The annual long march through the streets by thousands of unionists wearing the picturesque uniform of their trades, was abandoned yesterday by the Federation of Labor and the Associated Building Trades, as being an "antiquated and luxurious" method of displaying labor's strength before the public. With the two leading labor bodies against the project, there is no possibility of a parade this year or next. President John Fitzpatrick, of the Federation advised the unions to save the money which they would expend in buying uniforms, banners, carriages and bands, and put it into a big defense fund with which he said labor "may keep a stiff upper lip and talk as saucily as it pleases to employers."
