## NORTH BEND'S CHAMBER OF COMMERCE.

Thursday evening is the night for the meeting of the North Bend Chamber of Commerce. The people of North Bend should take special pains to attend every meeting and should take hold of every question with the largest possible vision. Coos Bay is a big thing and it is not to be expected that any small calibre man will be able to measure its value or necessities. It is bigger than either North Bend or Marshfield and bigger than all the communities around it put together. The Chamber of Commerce of North Bend needs to be very active if it does its full duty in helping to preserve and improve the Bay. The same can be said of the Chamber of Commerce of Marshfield. So far as industries are concerned the effort of each one of the commercial bodies should be to interest people and capital to come here and locate somewhere on Coos Bay. Let them do their best to get the location in their own limits if they can, but if they can't then induce them to locate on the Bay. The chambers should work together. Indeed, they realize this fully and it was for that reason that the meetings of the chambers are to be held on different evenings—that of Marshfield on Friday and that of North Bend on Thursday. It is much to be hoped that the members of the two chambers will exchange visits and it would be a good thing if the North Bend chamber inaugurated a plan of special features, such as an address on some commercial subject at each meeting, as the Marshfield chamber has done. It would increase the interest of members and bring new members into the body.

## POSSIBILITIES.

The future holds, in all probability more astonishing marvels than have yet been dreamed of. The present, however, is startling and interesting enough to make the most dependent would-be suicide stay his hand and live, if he would only look at the long procession of wonders which might engage his attention. Every day gives us a wonder and when we have looked at it for a while it gets commonplace in view of the new attractions which press in upon us. The lightning rod, the "wireless," the coach and four, the steam engine, the locomotive, the trolley car, the auto and the dirigible balloon. The Daguerreotype, the photograph, moving pictures, phonograph, linotype. These are all the inventions of a short time.

Now Edison tells us he will enable us to put up three story concrete buildings in half a day. More than this. He tells us he has patents applied for which will give him the sole right to make certain types of iron moulds which can be set up very speedily and into which this concrete can be poured for the walls of buildings. There are not many people in the world who represent more than one idea all through life, but Edison isn't one of them. A house built in half a day, so far as the walls up to and including three stories are concerned, is a possibility.

## THE PENSION LIST.

It is reported that the pension roll of the United States government has decreased since last year 18,600. This is the most startling reminder the American people have had since the great civil war that the Grand Army of the Republic is rapidly passing away and that millions of dollars which the government has annually expended in pensions will soon cease to find their way into circulation through that channel. It will not be many years now when the history of that great war will have become merely a tradition. The last pension check will be signed and received for in a few short years, so far as the civil war is concerned. Whether some terrible cataclysm will overturn the system and bring

hostile forces to the slaughter of each other again, can not be foretold. Probably it will, for it has been repeated so frequently at intervals in the history of mankind, that its recurrence is to be expected. But it may be safely asserted that no war will ever be waged in the name of more sacred principles and no results of any war will ever excel those of the civil war in their value to humanity.
