

European Mines Worked Since Nero's Time Reported Giving Out.

ABOUT EXHAUSTED

Amber threatens to give out. Mines which have been known since the time of Nero are being rapidly exhausted.

Almost all the amber of commerce is derived from the mines on the Baltic coast of Prussia. It is found in a dark brown bituminous deposit about thirty feet thick.

Considerable quantities used to be washed ashore after storms, but this the amber fishers are turning to other occupations. They used to gather twenty tons a year on the sands, and about 400 tons has been the average output of the mines for three years.

The price has risen to \$35 a pound. The director of the mines does not think the suply will last much more than five years longer.


