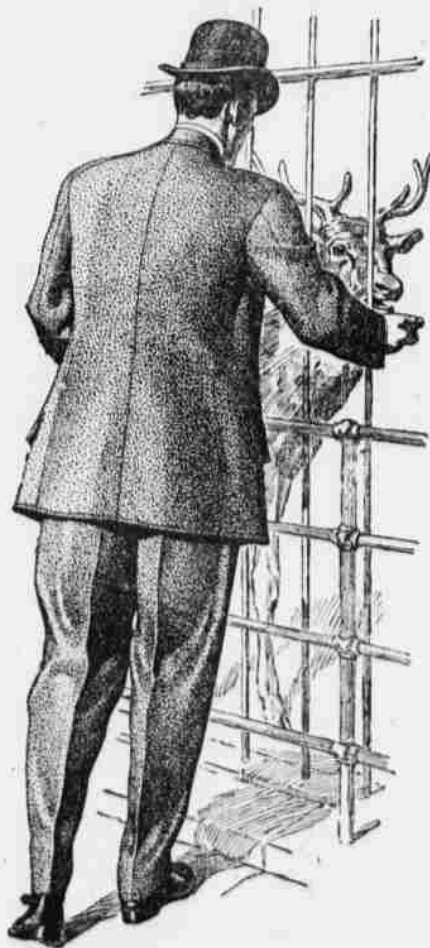
LEAVES FOR HONOLULU

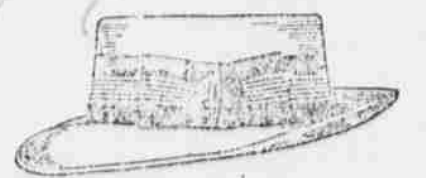
