MILLIONAIRE ON TRIAL.

Hartje to Answer For Defaming His Wife's Character.

PITTSBURG, Feb. 24.—Augustus Hartje, the millionaire paper manufacturer, John L. Weishons, hardware dealer, and Clifford Hooe, a negro, formerly employed by Hartje as a coachman, named as co-respondent in the divorce suit of Hartje against his wife, Mrs. Mary Scott Hartje, were placed on trial today in the criminal court, charged with conspiracy to blacken the character of Mrs. Hartje. Hooe was brought from the penitentiary, where he is serving a seven-year sentence for perjury in connection with the divorce case.

BURNED TO DEATH.

One Woman Loses Life and Several Others Seriously Injured.
