BANDON PULP MILL COMPANY ORGANIZED.

Directors of New Factory are Selected and will Start Business Soon.

The stockholders of the Bandon Pulp & Paper Mill met and elected the following directors: R. E. L. Beddison, O. A. Trowbridge, J. J. Stanley, C. T. Blumenrother, F. J. Marshall, W. D. Marshall and L. J. Cody. The whole board have been identified with the enterprise from the beginning and are heavily interested. Much interesting discussion of the project was indulged regarding ways and means, and methods of procedure. The directors will continue the present organization, will push the work of building and expect to double the present stock within a short time. The site, water supply, wharfage and contracts for unlimited supplies of wood have already been secured; Mr. Marshall, who is one of the most highly recommended paper mill men in the country, has been engaged to manage the industry.—Bandon Recorder.
