Two Vessels Sail.—The *Zarina* and *Gasco* left Coos Bay today for San Francisco, the *Zarina* being loaded with coal and the *Gasco* with lumber.

Lay Keel for Boat.—Krusse and Banks have laid the keel for the new coasting steamer which they are building for Charles Thom of North Bend.

Ben Merchant Better.—Ben Merchant, who is confined at the general hospital with malaria, is reported doing as nicely as could be expected, which will be gratifying news to his friends.

Special Masses.—Special masses will be held at the Catholic church Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday at 9 o'clock each morning, the Rev. Father Donnelly, the pastor, being the celebrant.

Engine Succeeds Oxen.—W. D. Mathews has given up the ox teams that have been used for years by him in his logging camp at Eastside, an engine being secured by him a few days ago to handle the work.

Excursion to Bandon.—Preparations are being made to run an excursion from Coos Bay to Bandon Sunday, April 25th. It is expected that a large number will go from here. A baseball game is likely to be one of the attractions.

Recovers from Operation.—Nels Burgham of the life saving station at Gardiner, who recently underwent an operation for appendicitis at the General hospital is reported rapidly improving. He will soon be able to return home.

Nann Smith in Today.—The Nann Smith reached Coos Bay from San Pedro and San Francisco today. She brought a Shea locomotive for the Smith-Powers Logging Company. She will load immediately with lumber for the south.

Eureka Out Today.—The steamship *Eureka* sailed today for Eureka, cutting out the trip to Portland as a result of the delay occasioned by encountering the sand spit. She is now on her regular schedule and will reach here Saturday en route to Portland.

Change Light Rules.—Inspectors Edwards and Fuller have been advised that a new rule requires gasoline launches to carry red, white and green lights, the same as steam vessels instead of merely having combination lights. Open launches under ten tons capacity come within the requirements of the ruling and operators must keep the lights burning and in a position to be shown to other vessels equipped with screens.
