FOR OREGON'S UNIVERSITY.

The people of Oregon ought to vote down the effort now being made to defeat an appropriation of \$125,000 for the Oregon State University.

Since the matter has been referred to the people for approval or rejection, the people should approve it by a decisive vote that will leave no doubt in the minds of future lawmakers as to the attitude of the people toward Oregon's institutions of learning.

The University of Oregon is making splendid progress, and is doing a noble and enduring work for the State. Given proper support, the support it deserves and ought to receive, the institution will broaden its sphere, extend its influence and become a larger force for good in Oregon.

THE VALUE OF LIFE AND LIMB.

Justice Morschauer of New York, the other day refused to accept the valuation of \$2,000 which a jury placed upon a boy's leg, when upon \$8,000 was fixed, which proved satisfactory.

Two hundred dollars for the death of a boy ten years old has been upheld on appeal. Likewise \$500, 1,186, \$2,000, \$2,500 and \$3,500, their ages disclosed greater discrepancy in the Lucas case a verdict of \$10,000 was held justified where a boy of three years lost the use of an arm and leg and his mind was impaired, while in Ehrman vs. Brooklyn City Railroad Company the General Term of the Supreme Court whose action was affirmed said that \$25,000 was not insufficient for the loss of a leg alone, although the ages were the same in both cases.

Verdicts for personal injury or death must necessarily be largely guesswork. Where permanent disfigurement results a higher amount is considered justified where the plaintiff is a woman, since her marriageability is impaired. The age, sex, occupation and earning capacity must be taken into consideration, and the general rule is that a verdict will not be set aside which does not indicate passion or prejudice on the part of the jury.
