ALLIANCE CASE WILL BE HEARD

United States Inspectors to Investigate Charges Made by Capt. Olson.

PORTLAND, Ore., April 18. — About May 1st an investigation into the alleged action of Captain Charles Bailey of the bar tug Tatoosh in attempting to "hold up" Captain B. W. Olson, master of the steamer Alliance, to bring his vessel into the Columbia River, December 2 and 3, when she was in a disabled condition, will be conducted by United States Inspectors Edwards and Fuller. Captain Olson has preferred charges against Bailey, and concludes his statement to the Government men as follows:

"This is certainly conduct unbecoming a master holding a master's license, and ask you to fully investigate this matter."

In crossing out over Coos Bay bar bound for Portland, November 28th, it will be remembered that the Alliance encountered a terrific storm. She was pounded about mercilessly by the mountainous seas. Finally her rudder stock was broken and she became helpless. A jury rudder was hastily constructed, and then the officers of the steamer began a fight for their own and passengers' lives in the face of a howling hurricane. For four days the skipper fought his way toward the mouth of the Columbia River, every moment looking as though it would prove the last to him and those in his charge. Half a dozen times the rudder was lost.

When the steamer finally arrived near the lightship, Olson says in his complaint that the tug Tatoosh went alongside, Bailey asking him to put a line on board. The Alliance captain insisted on knowing what the towing charge would be, as he did not believe it ought to be a salvage case. He declares that Bailey would give him no direct answer. Failing to come to terms in the dickering, Olson says he decided to wait until the following morning, when he

would cross in without assistance.

For a while, it is alleged, the Tatoosh stood by trying to convince him that he should take a tow. In time Bailey left, but returned in the afternoon and then, it is claimed, he tried to frighten the passengers by shouting the Alliance would drift ashore before morning. He insisted on being given the privilege of taking them on the Tatoosh to prevent their being drowned. Olson says that Bailey well knew it would have been impossible to transfer the passengers in small boats on account of the high running seas.

The following morning the tug skipper returned and renewed his dickering tactics of take in the Alliance. At the same time he carried a letter in his pocket from the local agent of the Alliance for delivery to Olson, instructing him to take the steamer in tow. After two hours of useless talk, it is recited in the complaint that the letter was delivered and the towage question settled.
