STRAY SHOTS PROVE MENACE

Ranchers Object to Careless Shooting by Excursionists —Endanger Life.

The careless use of firearms by members of pleasure parties on the rivers and inlets running out of Coos Bay is the cause of much complaint by residents near the streams. Numerous instances of narrow escapes from bullets are reported and some of the ranchers are almost frantic lest some member of their family be killed.

It is stated that many of these stray bullets find a dangerous lodging ground on account of the ignorance of some concerning the glancing caused by the water. A number of ranchers have appealed to The Times to urge that members of pleasure parties exercise care in the use of firearms. The ranchers generally like to see the excursionists have a good time so long as they do not prove a menace to their lives or property. Unless the excursionists begin to exercise more care, the ranchers declare they will resort to a means of compelling them to be careful as shown by the following letter:

Children in Danger.

SUNNY NOOK FARM, April 29. —Editor Coos Bay Times: Will you kindly allow me space in The Times to call attention to the reckless practice of promiscuous shooting along the waterways of the country? Last Sunday, about 4 p. m., a gasoline launch, the name of which I have also of a part of those on board, while passing my place on Coos river, a number of shots were fired, if not point-blank at my house sufficiently so that several bullets struck in the yard where my children were playing and one bullet struck a bedroom window passing into the room.

Now, I do not know if there is a law to prohibit this practice or not, but I do know there is a moral law that gives me the right to protect my family and that law is going to be enforced in the future in such a manner as the courts will sustain me in if possible, but if impossible to enforce it in that way. Well, I am going to protect my family regardless of consequences. This particular party of Sunday excursionists are no worse than dozens of others in this respect, but it is a practice that must be stopped or serious trouble may be the consequence.
