Equal suffrage is again brought to the fore in a communication recently issued by Mrs. Abigail Scott Duniway, President of the Oregon State equal suffrage association.

Gentlemen, Voters, Sons, Brothers, I am growing old. But I cannot rest until you have given us the victory.

You are equipped with ballots. We are not. We are depending upon you to honor our flag of truce by voting Yes in our behalf in this unequal contest.

This movement grew from the small beginning in 1872, above noted, until the year 1884, when your representatives submitted for us, by legislative enactment, a constitutional amendment at the State election of that year, which brought us 11,223 votes.

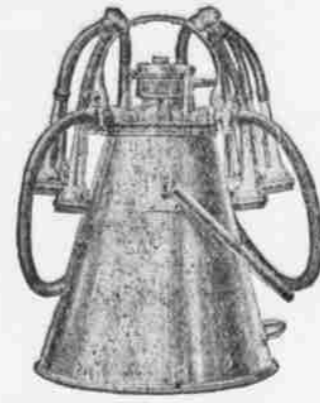
