

OTHER STATES GOING "DRY"

Majority in North Carolina
Against Liquor About 50,000
—New Law Drastic.

RALEIGH, N. C., May 28.—North Carolina was carried for statewide prohibition today by a majority es-

timated at 40,000 to 42,000 on reports received up to midnight.
The Prohibition ticket carried 78 out of the 98 counties by overwhelming majorities. The Prohibition ticket has carried 20 counties by majorities approximating 5600. This calculation is partly based upon estimates and the Prohibition leaders say that it is possible for the Prohibition majority to reach 50,000.
The election passed off very quietly, no disturbances of any importance being reported.
The total vote cast in the state was about 175,000.
Every large town in the state ex-

cept Wilmington and Durham went prohibition.
Under the regulations of the prohibition bill submitted to the people there will be no manufacture or sale of intoxicating liquors in the state after January, 1909.
