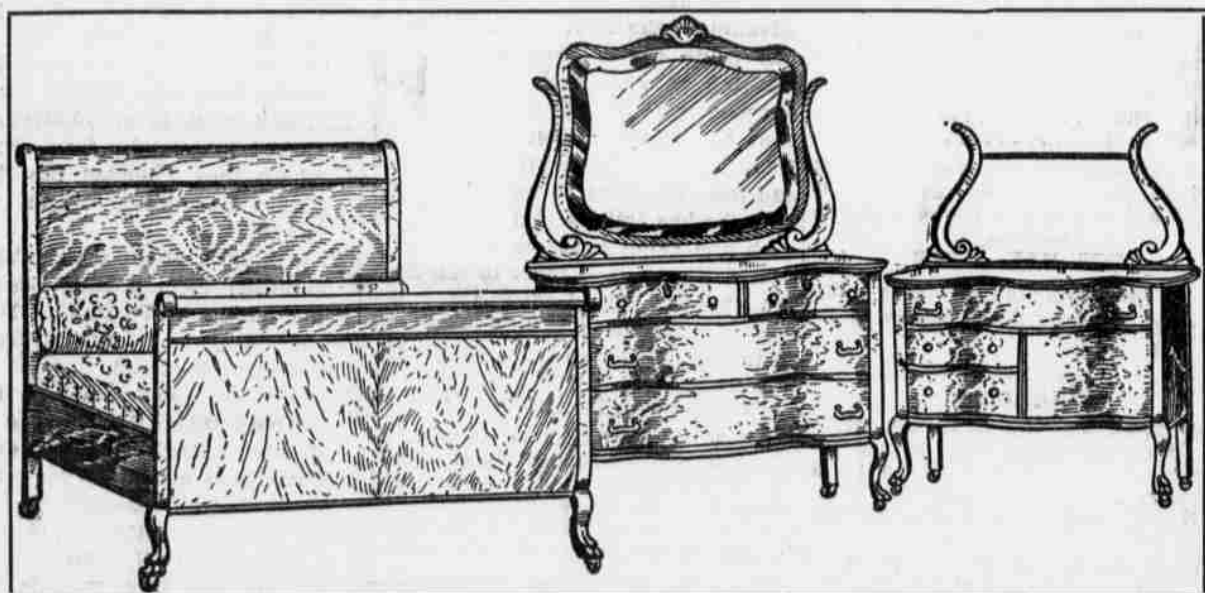

TUITION RATE IS ADVANCED

Marshfield School Board Increases Non-Resident Pupil Fees.

At a meeting of the Marshfield school board yesterday, the tuition to be charged non-resident pupils of the local schools was raised from \$5, \$7.50 and \$10 per term to \$10 flat per term or \$30 per year. The school board decided that this was only fair to the property owners of Marshfield who were paying taxes to build and maintain a good system. The advance in tuition will fall heaviest on the suburbs, especially the Bunker Hill and Bay Park districts which recently voted against consolidation with the Marshfield schools.

The annual salary of the clerk was raised from \$100 to \$150 per year. John F. Hall has just been reelected clerk after serving sixteen years consecutively in that capacity.

It was decided that the ensuing school year should open Monday, September 21.

New Building.
As a result of the bond issue of \$50,000 having carried at the special election yesterday, steps have been taken to rush work on the proposed new high school. Bids for the contract will be advertised for on Coos Bay and in Portland to be opened in thirty days. Architect Hendricks is now here and expects that the building can be completed about December 1. The new structure will be a little larger than originally intended and will be frame on a concrete foundation.
