HELPING YOUR HOME TOWN.

The first duty of every public-spirited citizen who has been able to accumulate so much money that he can afford to make business ventures of any character is to do so in the community which has furnished the basis for his good fortune.

If every man who makes money in a city or town should invest it elsewhere it would soon prove to be a milking process that in the end would exhaust its vitality and cripple its recuperative powers.

It is on precisely the same principle as reaping a heavy crop of produce from an acre of land every year with no rest or application of helpful fertilizers.

No community can long thrive under such circumstances. The business that prospers is the one whose managers put its profits into its resources, and thus give it a renewed stimulus.

If there is anything lacking in a town which would enlarge its business and increase its population, the man whose property interests permit him to gather large sums in rents every year should employ his surplus capital thus secured in supplying that want.

The way to build up any town is for its property owners to see that it gets in return the benefit of the profits which they have gotten from its people. Any other process produces certain commercial atrophy and industrial paralysis.
