Leaves For Portland to Conclude Arrangements For Telephone System.

R. T. Durett, who was granted a franchise to install an automatic telephone system on Coos Bay by the Marshfield city council the other night, left this morning for Portland to close the negotiations for materials, etc. Mayor E. E. Straw practically promised Mr. Durett yesterday, according to the latter's statement, that he (Straw) would sign the franchise at once. This morning Mayor Straw was going over the franchise with City Attorney Farrin to determine whether he would sign it or not.

There is still a mere possibility that Mr. Durett may purchase the local exchanges of the Pacific States Telephone Company. The securing of the franchise will enable him to drive a better bargain than he could otherwise have done. If he secures the Pacific States' exchange, he will probably not take the new franchise but will merely improve the present system.
