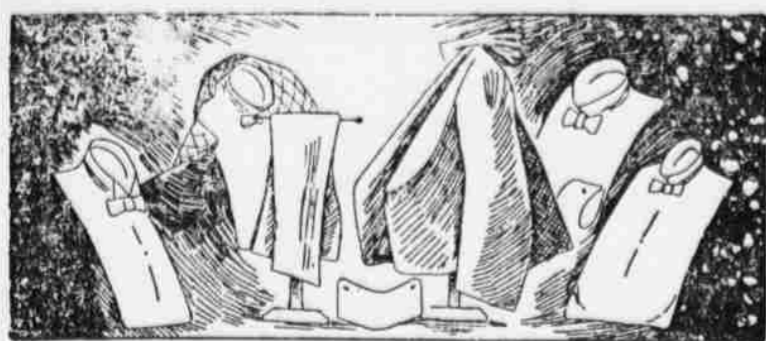

**Old Traveling Man Leaves.**—J. C. Yale of San Francisco, the nestor of the traveling men making Coos Bay, left here today for Gardiner. Mr. Yale is eighty-four years old and has been running in here for the past thirty-five years, representing Levi Strauss & Company of San Francisco, wholesale dry goods men, most of the time. **The Heather at Empire.**—The government lighthouse tender Heather arrived at Empire dock last night with Capt. D. J. Byrne on the bridge. Its arrival entitles new life in the veins of some of the old residents. The object of the visit of the tender is to convey material for the repairs for the bridge from the lighthouse to the main land, under the supervision of Captain A. E. Withers, who accompanies the Heather and will be domiciled at the Arago lighthouse indefinitely.
