MAY ORGANIZE MILITIA HERE

Movement to Secure Company of Oregon National Guard For Coos Bay Started.

Adjutant General W. E. Finzer of the Oregon National Guard is desirous of having a company of militia organized on Coos Bay and has taken the matter up with Walter Lyon, secretary of the Chamber of Commerce who will probably refer it to these with military ambitions. Mr. Lyon believes that a strong company could be organized here owing to the large number of young men on the Bay who are eligible.

The southern district of Oregon is divided into the Fourth regiment of the O. N. G. The full complement of a regiment is twelve companies and at present there are only eight companies. Adjutant General Finzer wants it recruited up to full strength.

In addition to furnishing the arms and equipment, the state gives \$500 per year towards the maintenance of the company's armory, etc. Ammunition for rifle practice and the expenses of the rifle teams for the annual contest are also borne by the state.

DIED AS SHE PREDICTED.
PENNINGTON, N. J., July 30.—Mrs. Martha Forster of this place, who was buried today, made a strange prediction about her death; which came true.

Mrs. Forster, who was eighty-nine years old, became ill a week ago. She was unconscious two days. When she awoke she said she would sleep three days and nights and then die. She again sank into unconsciousness, remained so for the period she predicted, awoke, asked for a drink of water and expired.

According to all indications, the fair will be the most successful exposition of the kind that has ever been pulled off in this section of Oregon if the management can go ahead and carry out their plans and not be handicapped for the small amount now required.

CARELESSNESS COSTS SIGHT

Supt. Jones of Illinois Declares Blindness Is Due Largely to Incompetent Physicians

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., July 31.—One-third of the blind children of this country are victims of careless physicians or midwives is the startling claim made by George W. Jones, superintendent of the Illinois school for the blind. Inflammation of the eyes of the new born is liable to result in an acute infection of the eyes soon after the opening and from one to three days after birth. One per cent of a solution of silver nitrate is an absolute specific for this disease says Superintendent Jones and can be administered without danger by the most untried physicians.
