

# WILL ENLARGE THE BUSINESS

### Roberts Marsden, Sr., Sells Half-Interest to W. F. Rau.

Negotiations that have been pending for sometime have been completed whereby Robert Marsden, Sr., disposes of one-half interest in his wholesale and retail liquor business to W. F. Rau, late of New York. The transaction includes the two wholesale liquor houses, one in Marshfield and one in Bandon, five saloons, the brewery and the Weinhard beer agency. The new concern will be a co-partnership under the firm-name of the Coos Bay Liquor Company.

Mr. Marsden found that the business was demanding more time than he could give it and some one to share the responsibilities of the business became necessary.

The new firm, which will be under the active management of Mr. Rau, plans to make extensive improvements and will enlarge the wholesale department. Work of remodeling the present quarters of the wholesale establishment has already been commenced. It will be increased to three times its present capacity and an ice-making plant installed to manufacture their own ice. They also will put three traveling men on the road to develop the jobbing end of the business.

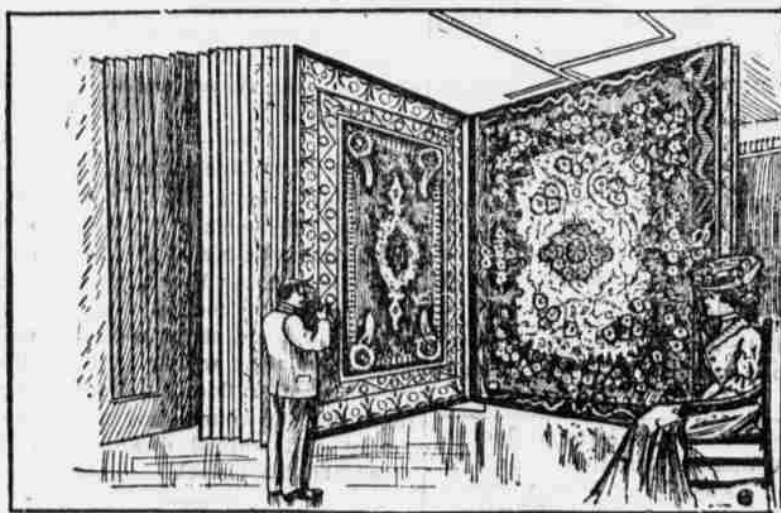

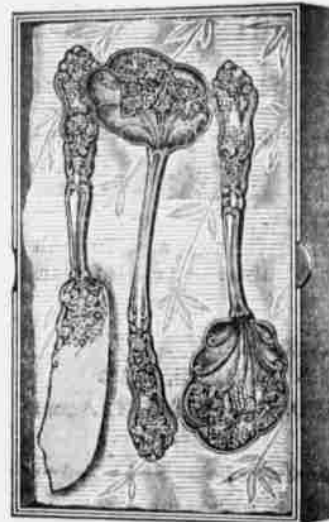
