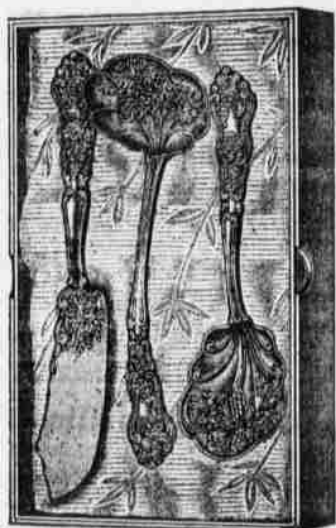

### SOUTHWEST OREGON NEWS GLEANED FOR TIMES READERS

#### SUICIDE AT MEDFORD.

Medford, Ore., Aug. 7.—Lawrence H. Besler, a wealthy real estate dealer of Wenatchee, Wash., aged 50 years, committed suicide by blowing off the top of his head with a rifle in the Nash hotel, in this city. He had sent for an acquaintance, and after shaking hands with him stepped into an alcove and ended his life. The cause of the act is unknown. Besler came to Medford for the purpose of buying an orchard.

#### PAVING AT ROSEBURG.

Roseburg, Ore., Aug. 7.—Ordinances authorizing the paving of 18 blocks of streets and the flotation of \$35,000 worth of bonds to defray 50 per cent of the cost thereof, as well as the total cost of a concrete-steel bridge over Deer Creek, which runs through the northern part of the city, were passed by the Roseburg council. Bids for the improvement work and on the bond issue are now advertised, and it is expected actual paving will begin within a month.

The Roseburg Commercial Club yesterday awarded a contract for erection of an advertising exhibit building on the Southern Pacific depot premises. The building will be open to visitors during the stoppage of all through trains passing here in daylight, and will be so constructed that its contents may be viewed from every direction without entering the building.

#### ADVICE FROM ALBANY.

#### PAUL DIMMICK BANKRUPT.

Receiver Appointed For Drain Saw Mill Man.

Roseburg, Ore., Aug. 7.—On petition of creditors, the Craig Lumber Company, and the Elk Creek Lumber Company, Judge Hamilton on Monday issued an order directing the sale by the receiver of the property of Paul M. Dimmick, a bankrupt, consisting of a sawmill near Drain, a tract of timberland and a quantity of sawed lumber. The petitioners set forth that owing to the slump in the lumber market the plant was depreciated in value daily, and that it could not be operated without a loss. The order of sale authorizes it either publicly or privately.

#### HERMANN CASE SOON.

Well-Known Oregon Man to be Tried For Land Frauds.

Portland, Ore., Aug. 7.—The grind of the land-fraud cases will be resumed Monday, October 12, when Mr. Becker has arranged for the trial of the Pacific Furniture & Lumber Company case. The trial of this case is expected to occupy fully four weeks, as the government has approximately 2,000 letters relating to the alleged conspiracy and which probably will be offered as exhibits. Following this case, the trial of Binger Hermann will be taken up, a postponement of this trial from the October term for which it had been set having been agreed to by the government at the request of A. S. Worthington, chief counsel for Hermann, who has gone for a trip abroad and will not return until fall.

In arranging this order of the cases Mr. Becker requested the court to set the retrial of the Williamson case immediately after the Hermann trial, for the reason that if Heney comes to Portland to try Hermann, which he intended to do, he would desire to retry the Williamson case at the same time. All of the other cases were continued until the October term, no definite date being set for any of them.

#### TROUBLE IS SERIOUS.

Capt. Robert Caughell Faces Severe Charge.

The Coquille Herald says: "Captain Robert Caughell, well-known in Curry county and along the coast of Coos, is in trouble at Eureka, California, according to reports. He had a serious mix-up with G. R. Geogerson, a prominent and wealthy citizen of that city, whom he accused of making improper advances to his young wife, and on whom he inflicted a terrible beating. Caughell, who has been employed of late as master of the ferry steamer Antelope plying on Humboldt Bay, sought to force Geogerson to sign a written confession of his guilt at the point of a revolver, lead to the personal encounter and Geogerson's serious injury. Caughell was arrested and placed under \$5,000 bonds."

#### PETTIBONE IS DEAD.

Noted Leader of Western Federation of Miners Succumbs.

Denver, Aug. 7.—George A. Pettibone, for years prominent in the councils of the Western Federation of Labor and charged with President Moyer and ex-Secretary W. D. Haywood with complicity in the murder of ex-Governor Steunenberg, of Idaho, died at St. Joseph's hospital from the effects of an operation for cancer. Mr. Pettibone had been ill practically ever since his confinement in the Idaho penitentiary, which began more than a year previous to the famous trials at Boise. Pettibone was tried and acquitted. He leaves a widow.

#### DOG FINDS LOST PIN.

Picks It Up and Hurries With It to Grateful Mistress.

Winsted, Conn., August 7.—Jack, a collie owned by James Maddrah of Hubbard street, recovered a valuable pin which had been lost in the woods and returned it to its owner, Miss Ida Maddrah, eldest daughter of his master.

Miss Maddrah lost the pin, which was a gift, while hunting for wild flowers with her little niece on a mountain side Sunday. She did not discover her loss until that night, and yesterday started out with Jack in quest of the pin. Half way up the hillside the dog found the pin and brought it to Miss Maddrah in his mouth.
