Fast On Mud.—"The Western," a lumber schooner new on the Bay, ran onto a high shoal in the lower bay and was fast for many hours. She will probably be pulled off this afternoon.

Bicyclist Hurt.—A Bach of Ferndale was slightly hurt in a bicycle accident on Broadway yesterday. His wheel struck a rough spot, throwing him to the ground and breaking the frame of the bicycle.

Physicians Meet.—The Coos County Medical Society held a regular meeting in Marshfield last evening. The principal event of the program was a paper by Dr. Taggart which was followed by a general discussion.

BUILDING IS ACTIVE HERE

Larger Number of New Structures Started Or Completed On Coos Bay Recently.

Few people in Marshfield or the Coos Bay country realize the amount of building there is going on here, indicating the growth and development now in progress. In addition to the 2,000,000 or more feet of plank that is being used in the construction of streets in the city of Marshfield besides the many blocks of bituminous rock paving now being put in, the new \$75,000 Chandler hotel, the \$50,000 High School in Marshfield and the \$40,000 High School in North Bend, and other big buildings, scores of residences and minor improvements are being made.
