DRAIN'S VIEW OF ROAD.

The Drain Nonpareil says: "The Coos Bay committee rode on Uncle Ed Harriman's special train from Roseburg to Eugene last Saturday and fully discussed the subject of resumption of work on the Drain-Coos Bay road. Harriman pretended that he was uncertain just when he would order the work completed. He said he would make the order at once, provided the committee could show him where it would be possible for him to earn 4 per cent interest on the \$5,000,000 it will take to build the road, for ten years from the date of completion.

The committee is sure they can come through with this showing, so it would not be any great surprise if work should resume yet this fall.

But it is our guess that nothing will be done before next spring.

With one million dollars' worth of steel bridge material piled at Drain, made expressly for this road; with five magnificent steel bridges already put up at this end of the line, with a greater portion of the grading done for a distance of 20 miles; with nearly 200,000 barrels of cement scattered all along the line; with nearly half of the work done on the four only tunnels on the route; with right of way paid for more than half of the distance, it is safe to conclude that this work will not be allowed to lag much longer. It would be too unreasonable to consider for a moment.
