Bandon Bar Improvement Is Rapidly Going Ahead.

It is thought however that sufficient money can be raised to complete the work this fall, and then Bandon will have a harbor, deep enough to let in most any sized vessel.—Bandon Recorder.

DIVIDE SCHOOL DISTRICT.

Attempt to Change No. 24 Deferred By Commissioners.

The attempt recently made to divide school district No. 24, adding that portion on the south side of the North Fork to Myrtle Point district No. 41, was not successful. The matter was presented to the district boundary board at Coquille and was laid on the table until November court meets. No. 24 has advertised the old school house and lot at the Rackliff place for sale and it is the intention of the board to build a new school house this winter at a point between the F. W. Lang and J. E. Wither's place on the north side of the river.—Myrtle Point Enterprise.

F. S. DOW APPLE

Gives View Concerning Proposed Advertisement County Produce

Marshfield, Or., Sept. 17, Editor Times: I see by your issue of last Friday night that you have had an elegant chance of a Coos County Gravensteins advertisement by not placing the name boxes and wrappers of our apples to Australia. I want you to think that I do not hide any of Coos County apples. As a matter of fact, it was a pointment to me that we have our boxes stamped and wrappers printed, but all the money and the volume of apples in Coos County Gravensteins at the present time is rather small to permit of it. The party to whom I sold these apples wanted 15,000 boxes. He bought them last year and came back again this year, which proves that the apples were satisfactory, and in all likelihood will be back next year. Anyone that will stop and think, will readily see that if this is the case we have a market for 15,000 boxes of Gravenstein apples every year. The present output of the county is approximately 4,000 boxes, so you see that we have lots of room to grow with this one variety.

Now as to price. I control 4,000 boxes of apples with him in doing so arranged for space 4,000 boxes aboard the steamer order to make connections with steamer we fell short 1,500 boxes which means that we are paying freight to Australia on 1,500 boxes of apples that are not aboard ship. When Coos county produce enough apples so that we can be satisfied what we are doing, on basis of the price that I received the apples this year I would gladly pay from 25c to 35c a box, or more and any other packer would do the same, for the risk would not be great, but naturally when we are handling a small quantity and order to pack this quantity must have our crews scattered from one end of the county to another, and contend with strikes among the packers, sickness in the farmers' families at such things, the expense is enormous and of course must come off the apples. But all these things will work their way out. The acreage each year is increasing and with the increase the facilities for handling will be improved and the time is not very far distant when any packer who ships apples from Coos county can afford to label the boxes in good shape and also have his wrappers printed so that wherever the apples go it will speak a good word for Coos county. The growers of the territory should have it impressed on their minds that the Gravenstein and that alone is the apple for this section. Our late apples come in competition with varieties that are better colored and will keep better than anything we grow here, and it is only when these outside crops fail that our late apples will bring a price; but our Gravensteins come at a time when there are practically no apples in the world and the world's markets are ours.
