

# NORTH BEND HIGH SCHOOL FORGES TO THE FRONT TODAY

## Result of the Lively Hustling of the Boys and Girls Shown in the Contest—Eastern Star Second; Lillian McCann, Third.

Today's count by the judges C. A. Sehlbrede and Tom Hall, to be verified later by W. P. Evans, makes some important changes in The Times' Prize Contest. # SCHOOL BOND ISSUE PLACED

## Marshfield District Places \$10,000 at Five Per Cent and \$104 Premium.

County Treasurer J. B. Dulley has just completed the sale of a \$10,000 bond issue by the Marshfield Independent school district to A. B. Leach and Company of Chicago, at five per cent, and a premium of \$104. The bids for this issue were received by the Marshfield school board up to October 22, and were forwarded by Clerk John F. Hall to Mr. Dulley.

There were several bidders for the bonds, the bids ranging higher than was expected on long term high class securities. The bids were as follows:

A. B. Leach and Company of Chicago, five per cent, and \$104 premium.

John Naveen and Company of Chicago, five per cent at \$175 below par.

John P. O'Brien and Company of Boston, six per cent, and \$275 premium.

# MANY LOST WITH VESSEL

**STEAMER YARAMOUTH FOUNDERS IN NORTH SEA WITH CREW OF TWENTY-EIGHT.**

(By Associated Press.) LONDON, Oct. 29.—Wreckage in the North Sea confirms the fear that the steamer Yaramouth foundered two days ago while crossing from the Hook of Holland to Harwich. She carried a crew of twenty-four men, and it is believed that all perished.
