NOTICE OF ANNUAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION OF THE CITY OF MARSHFIELD.

Notice is hereby given that on Tuesday, the first day of December, 1908, there will be held at the City Hall of the City of Marshfield, Coos County, Oregon, a regular general election, for the purpose of electing two members of the Common Council to serve for the term of three years each; for the purpose of electing one Recorder to serve for the period of one year; and for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said City for their approval or rejecting an ordinance to amend Section 110 of the Charter of said City to increase the limit of indebtedness to five per cent of the assessed valuation of the property within the corporate limits of the City; and for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said City for their approval or rejection an ordinance to amend Subdivision 34 of Section 28 of the Charter of said City to authorize and empower the Common Council to issue and dispose of Bonds of said City not exceeding the sum of \$42,000.00 payable in not less than ten nor more than twenty years, with interest at the rate of five per cent, for the purpose of redeeming and paying off the warrant indebtedness of said City.

The said election will be held between the hours of nine o'clock A. M. and six o'clock P. M.

That John C. Merchant, A. P. Owen, and R. C. Cordes have been heretofore by the Common Council of said City appointed as Judges of said election, and D. L. Rood, C. H. Marsh and George Farrin as Clerks of said election.

BOOST FOR COOS BAY.

Editor Coos Bay Times:

Each recurring day should remind the people of Coos Bay that the time is near at hand when Congress will again convene and that each day should mark some distinct advance in perfecting the detail of a definite plan of campaign for procuring an adequate appropriation from this congress for the contemplated improvements of Coos Bay and bar. From recent advices, it would appear that no appropriation has been recommended by the Board of Engineers to the Committee on Harbors and Rivers so far as the interests of Coos Bay are concerned, however, whether this be the status of the matter, or otherwise, it is essential that prompt, definite and decisive action should be at once taken and every detail of a vigorous campaign carefully arranged to the end that the matter may properly be presented to congress at the earliest possible day, and this may be accomplished in but one way, and that, by sending capable representatives from Coos Bay to Washington City to begin a "bombardment" on the first day of the session of congress. True, we have two senators and two representatives from Oregon whom we expect, and are assured, will do all in their power to procure the necessary aid from congress; but we must not be unmindful of the fact that these gentlemen are driven from pillar to post by other and numerous localities in this state who are demanding a consideration of their interests as well as many matters of National concern to which they are required to give more, or less time—this means that they cannot give to Coos Bay the attention that will be required to accomplish the desired ends without an additional stimulus by having present in Washington some of our own people to push the work. We should also see that senators and representatives in the other states are made to become interested in the work, this may be done by those who are now in this locality from the outside states. Letters should go out to influential friends in the states with an earnest request that their influence be used on their respective senators and representatives to aid our own members of congress in this important work, this would undoubtedly result in bringing good results and when such assistance is promised by outside members of congress to their own respective constituents, they would undoubtedly give their support to such measures as are championed by our own congressmen pointing to an appropriation for Coos Bay. Enough time has been expended in discussing these important matters and the time has now arrived for definite and aggressive action.


