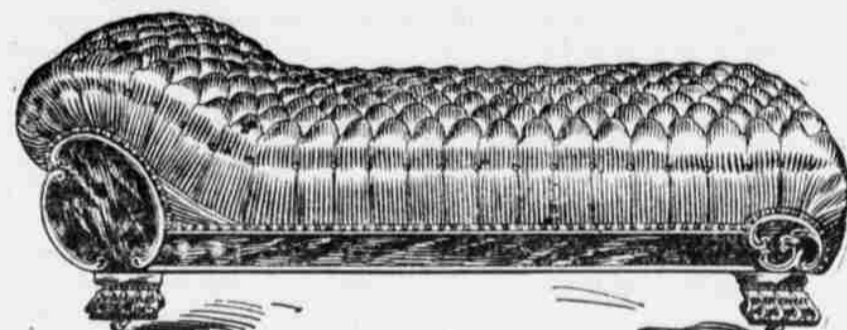

Every saw mill is operating full handed. The North Bend Lumber Company have several months' cutting on one order.

Mr. McCord, of the Coos Bay Lumber and Coal Company is here straightening up the affairs of the Larson Timber Company.

M. Hiscoc, the manager of the Box factory, is getting everything in readiness to start up with a full force after the first of the year.

The boiler plant for the new electric light plant at Porter is about completed. This plant is supposed to develop 800 horse power when in operation.

M. M. Johnson who is figuring on an electric road from Roseburg to Coos Bay was on a still hunt in North Bend yesterday. He looked the situation over thoroughly.

The painters are busy on Grann's new structure. The building will be completed next month. It is a three story building fronting on Sherman avenue between Washington and Virginia avenue.

The Sash and Door Factory people are constructing additional wharfage and a warehouse to take care of their increasing business. They have been cramped for room the past six months.

A committee of twenty was appointed at last Thursday's meeting of the North Bend Chamber of Commerce to canvass the city for funds for boosting purposes for the year 1909. The committee starts on its labors Monday.
