BOSTON WOMAN SUES CHAMPION STINGY MAN FOR DIVORCE

BOY BEATS GIRLS AS COOK

Missouri University Boy Is Also A Prize Dishwasher—Intends to Be a Farmer.

COLUMBIA, Mo., Dec. 18.—A 20-year-old farmer boy, Charles R. Howell of Holliday, Mo., who entered the home economics department at the State University in September, has proved himself the equal of the coeds at cooking and dish-washings. Another man, Glen Crawford of Atlanta, Mo., entered the home economics with Howell, but abandoned the course.

On Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 8 o'clock to 10 Mr. Howell bakes and boils and stews. There are eleven coeds in the class, but the instructor, Miss Leighton, says Howell is as good as any of them, and makes sponge cake, flap jacks, apple fritters, vegetable soup and boils meats with the skill of a royal chef.

When asked about his prowess with the rolling pin and the dishrag, Mr. Howell was diffident. "I am a student in the Teachers' College high school," he said, "and will enter the agricultural department next fall. I am taking the home economics work to make entrance credit in the university. I never cooked any till I entered the laboratory, and the girls all have me bested there. I am going to be a Missouri farmer, and a farmer ought to know all about everything done on his place."

When asked if he thought he would make a better husband for some pretty girl because of his cooking skill, Howell laughed and said, "Surest thing you know." Howell comes of a pioneer Missouri family, and his father is H. A. Howell of Holliday, a farmer. He has been in Columbia two years attending the Teachers' College high school, to make enough credits to enter the agricultural college, and has made his own living ever since he came here by selling papers.

DECLARES THAT HE NEARLY HAD A FIT WHEN SHE WASTED FOUR CENTS WORTH OF MILK IN A YEAR.

FEWER MARRIAGES THAN LAST YEAR

New York's Social Register Shows a Decrease of 20 Per Cent Over Previous Year.

NEW YORK, Dec. 18.—Diminution of 20 per cent in the number of marriages among persons whose names appear in the Social Register for New York is noted in the Social Register for 1909, which was published yesterday. Not only has the number of marriages in this city this year been 20 per cent less than the number last year, but there has been a general decrease in the number of marriages throughout the country among those persons whose names appear in the social registers in various cities. This general decrease has been one of 7 per cent.

In the Social Register for New York for 1909, the number of marriages is announced as 662, while the number of marriages noted in the Social Register last year was 763.

In Philadelphia among the persons whose names appear in the Social Register for that city there were 124 marriages this year, as against 242 last year. In Washington there were 151 this year and 132 last year. In Boston there were 147 this year and 167 last year.
