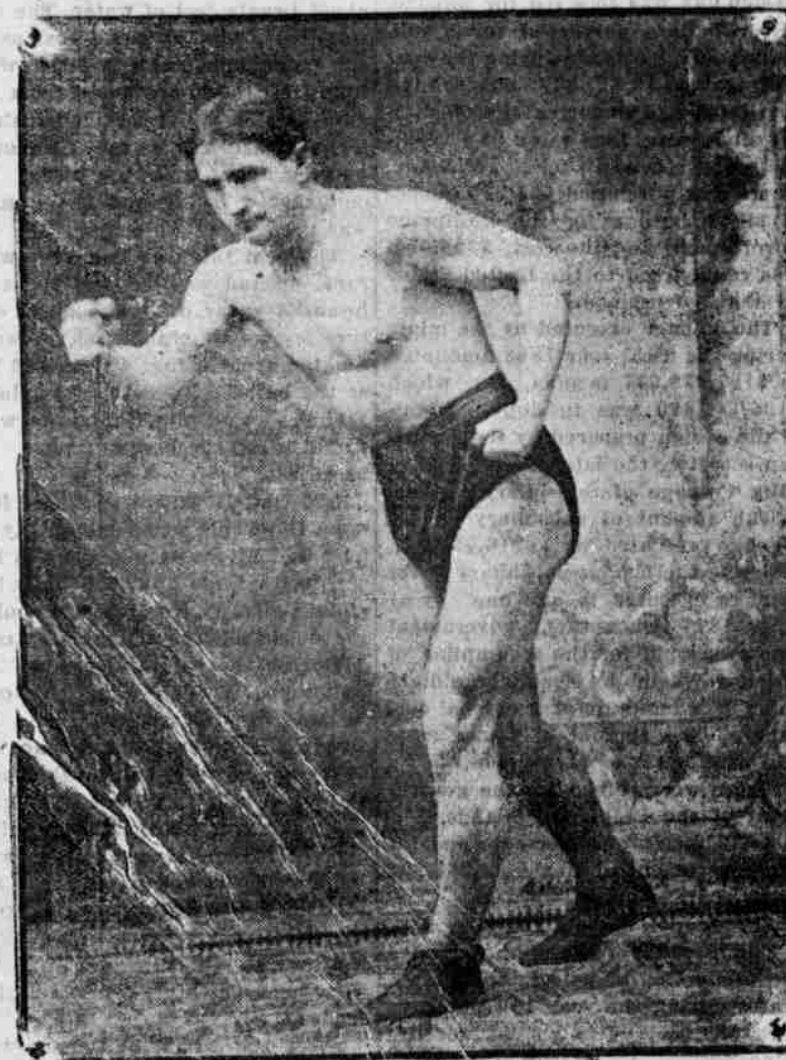

NEW YORK THINKER SAYS THAT PERFECT MODE OF EXISTENCE IS COMING AND WILL ELIMINATE DEATH.

NEW YORK, Dec. 23.—Eventually it will not be necessary for man to pass through the gateways of birth and death, for he will live an endless life.

So says Charles Brodie Patterson, lecturer and exponent of a somewhat radical school of New Thought.

 "From the source come all the de-

grees of life and "intelligence."
 "From the lowest to the greatest, life is ever becoming manifested through form building."
 That was about all the int. view could absorb at one sitting, and she feebly indicated that her departure was imminent.

Extending a hand that felt like an underdone muffin, the proud exponent of a "long life and a merry one" benignly expressed the "hope that the public would be benefited by the visible manifestation of his sacred ego."
