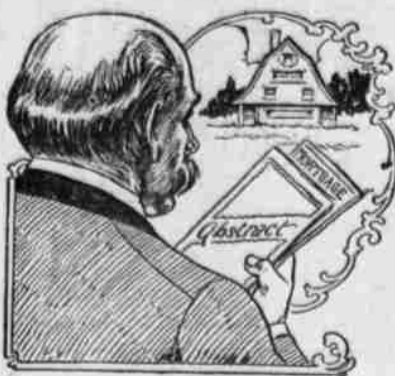

OCTOGENARIAN CUTS TEETH

Aged New Hampshire Man Repeats Experience of His Early Youth.

CLAREMONT, N. H., Dec. 26. — William H. Harrington, who will be 81 years old in January, is enjoying the unusual distinction of cutting his third set of teeth. Already two new ones have come in front of the upper jaw, and others are sprouting. Mr. Harrington is about as sprightly as a boy and is exceedingly proud of his latest acquisition.

"I never had the toothache in my life, and no dentist has ever had anything to do with my mouth," said the aged man. "My first teeth did not loosen and come out until I was about 30 years old and by the time I was 50 my second ones had all come. These didn't wear as well as the first and when I was 75 I had lost them all but two, which still remain. Sometimes they would drop out and again I would pull them out with my fingers."

"I take a drink when I want it and have used tobacco ever since I was a boy. I always maintain that if tobacco was good enough to chew the juice was good enough to swallow, and this I have always done. I cannot see that it has done me any harm and when my third teeth began to prick through last June I made up my mind that the tobacco might have done it by preserving the roots.

"I have always eaten heartily of meat and avoided sweet stuff. That's what ruins the teeth. If the young folks would stop eating so much candy and smoking cigarettes and not stay out so late nights at dancing parties they would have better eyes and better teeth and be stronger every way. CURE FOR INSOMNIA.

Open Air, Deep Breathing and Indifference Do Work.

What, then, can the sleepless woman do to help herself. Let her note, in the first place, some things that she ought not to do. She ought not to drink tea or coffee, especially toward bedtime; for these stimulate the brain.

She ought not to spend all her time indoors, but rather live much in the open air and breathe deeply the while. She ought not, immediately before retiring, to read thrilling stories of "battle, murder, and sudden death." She ought, above all, says Samuel McComb, in Harper's Bazar, not to fear the idea of not sleeping; and the fear of not sleeping will be dissipated by the firm conviction that, even though she should remain awake for hours, some, at least, of the benefits of sleep can be obtained by using those hours aright. One goes to bed primarily to rest; secondarily to sleep. If one does not sleep, one should not keep turning over and over, growing more and more impatient with one's self, but should impose on the mind calm, peace and a state as near vacuity as possible. As has been well said, "Sleep is like a pigeon. It comes to you if you have the appearance of not looking for it. It flies away if you try to catch it." If possible, approach bedtime with a feeling of indifference and learn to say within yourself, "If I sleep—well; if I don't sleep—also well, though not so well." This little lesson thoroughly learned will have the most beneficial influence in attracting sleep. Assuring, then, that the sufferer has removed the physical causes of sleeplessness—that noise and light and material discomforts are excluded—there is now no reason for the insomnia.

She has but to suggest to herself properly or talk to herself sleep for a while, and it will come. Relax the limbs. Close the eyes, inhale a few deep breaths, and repeat silently and slowly some such formula as this: "There is now no reason why I should not sleep. I can sleep. Therefore I will sleep. I will sink down lower and lower. I am sinking down. I know I am now going to sleep. I feel sleep coming. It is here. I sleep, sleep, a long, unbroken sleep."
