Actor - Manager Announces Personnel of His New Troupe.

Our old actor friend James Keane returns to us, theatrically, after an absence of four years. This is good news indeed. The Keane Company or as Jim proposes to call his organization, "The Coos County Home Stock Company" will open at the Odd Fellows Hall on Saturday, January 9. The play will be Fabio Romani taken from the most famous novel of that great writer of fiction, Marie Correll. The company is a very strong one, a far more powerful organization than any Mr. Keane has yet brought to the Bay and that is saying a great deal. James Keane is distinctly a metropolitan actor having played many leading roles on the New York stage. I immediately got busy on the wires and stole her away from Fred Belasco, manager of the Alcazar Stock Company of San Francisco, whom I learned had mailed her a contract for an extended engagement at the Alcazar.

Well, my wire overtook and beat out the contracts and there you are, or rather here she is, and you just watch her make good. Why the critics in--well, wait and see for yourself. Next, I got Miss Virginia Ames certainly one of the sweetest and most accomplished ingenues in the business. I can just see some of my Coos Bay friends going dots over her. Miss Daisy Swaybel is also a little crackjack and has a wonderful line of specialties. She lately arrived in Prisco over the Orpheum circuit. Miss Marjorie Dalton, late of Manhattan Operatic Company besides being a beautiful and clever actress, has a magnificent voice, and should become a big favorite from the start.

Regarding the men, my old heavy man is back with me, Richards Clay, True Boardman, one of the best known leading men on the coast is also along. My comedian Edmund Flynn. Well he can make me laugh and that's going some. J. Lionel Swift is a character actor of sterling worth and is a master on dialects. Ashley C. Cooper an Eng'-h actor of wide experience who came to this company originally with Wilson Barrett in the "Sign of the Cross," is a clever character man. ## NORWAY ASKS FOR RAILWAY

Residents On North Fork of Coquille Take Up Matter With Company.

COQUILLE, Ore., Jan. 7.—Residents of the North Fork of the Coquille are said to be anxious for the building of a branch line of railway leading up that stream. So states W. K. Foote of Norway.

Mr. Foote had been over to Coos Bay, and while there talked with Manager C. J. Mills on the subject. That gentleman expressed a desire to meet a committee of North Fork citizens and learn the nature of the proposition to be offered.

Mr. Foote says that the timber of that section offers the principal output for a road, which is a matter of course, and if the road were built there would be much more logging in that section. The timber interests of the North Fork are chiefly active for the line. Its diverging point from the main tracks of the C. B. & E. would likely be near Norway.

A meeting of interested residents to discuss the matter and see what can be offered the railway company in the form of inducement is soon to take place.
