THE PANAMA CANAL.

THREE YEARS AGO a commission of civil engineers was created to study and report upon the question as to whether the Panama canal should be made with locks or upon a sea level from ocean to ocean. This commission consisted of five European engineers, recommended by their respective governments and Seven Americans, selected by the president of the United States. After thorough investigation, five foreigners and three Americans making a majority of two-thirds, reported in favor of the sea level ditch. The senate, at the time was disposed to favor the majority report. The president, however, insisted on the acceptance of the report of the minority and this report, recommending a canal with locks, was adopted with some foreboding as to its success. It will be very interesting to hear the reports of Mr. Pultizer with his corps of practical engineers and of President-elect Taft who will sail for the canal zone with a corps of specialists on January 25th, and also the report of the volunteer congressional delegation that has already started for Panama.
