THE WATER WAGON IS A COMMON CARRIER

Oklahoma House of Representatives
Makes Official Recognition of the Water Cart.

GUTHRIE, Okla., Jan. 23.—A resolution declaring the "water wagon" of Oklahoma to be a common carrier was introduced in the house by Representative "Bill" Durant, democrat, and passed with a whoop and sent to the senate for concurrence.

The preamble declares that the welfare of the people demands that the state-wide prohibition law have the moral support of the entire citizenship of the state, and concludes with the following resolution:

"It is the sense of the second legislature of Oklahoma that a law be enacted declaring the water wagon to be a common carrier, and requiring that seats thereon be made wider, with high backs and side rails, comfortably cushioned, and provided with head rests, in order that passengers on such conveyances may travel with some degree of comfort, without danger of falling off, and without excuse for voluntarily quitting the ride on account of inadequate accommodations and comforts."

RETURNS TO COLLEGE FOR DIPLOMA AFTER 25 YEARS

Indianan Will Complete Course at University Which He Began Over Quarter of Century Ago.

BLOOMINGTON, Ind., Jan. 23.—After being out of college for exactly twenty-five years, Charles Wesley Egner, 49 years of age, of Warsaw, Ind., has re-entered Indiana University, and will continue the regular college work to complete his bachelor degree.

Mr. Egner first entered Indiana University in 1881, when there were only 200 students at the institution and only one building. He attended college for three years, but was unable to complete his course then. He took up teaching and always desired to return and get his degree. Not until this year did he see his opportunity. He has enrolled in calculus, penology and crime, European political history and the English classes.

Mr. Eugene is a member of the Phi Kappa Psi fraternity, and says that he is glad to be back with his younger fraternity brothers. He delighted them as they bunched around him with stories of gay times twenty-five years ago, when five fraternities fought desperately for their share of the 200 students.

THRIFTY FRANCE HAS \$45,000,000,000

"World's Banker" Get Annual Income of \$380,000,000 From Other Countries.

PARIS, Jan. 23.—Although general trade conditions in France, as in other European countries, suffered this year, largely because of the reduction in American demand following the financial crisis, figures submitted by Leroy-Beaulieu and other statisticians at the end of the year regarding the wonderful wealth of the French people demonstrate the imposing strength of France's financial position and her right to the title of "The World's Banker." France's fortune is growing steadily as the result of an annual saving of \$1,000,000,000, much of which must seek investment abroad.

M. Leroy-Beaulieu's figures show that France now receives \$360,000,000 as an annual income from foreign holdings, principally government bonds, the amount having been almost doubled in the last fifteen years. He estimates the present wealth of the French people at \$45,000,000,000, or more than \$1,000 for every man, woman and child, and as the estimate is based upon declared succession taxes, it is admittedly much below the real figures. M. Leroy-Beaulieu takes no account of the vast amount of gold and securities which the French, especially the peasants, keep in concealment, and which probably rivals the hidden treasures of India.

TAFT OUT OF JOHN D. CLASS

Millionaire Only Plays Nine-Hole Golf While President-Elect Plays Eighteen, So Match Is Off.

AUGUSTA, Ga., Jan. 23.—There is not going to be a golf match—much to the disappointment of this city—between John D. Rockefeller, and President-elect Taft, who has been playing what he calls "bumpie puppy" for several weeks.

The trouble is, according to friends of both, that their games differ too widely. John D. gets rather weary when he has completed nine holes. He puts his clubs away and quits quite after that. The nine-hole game is his maximum.

Not so, Judge Taft. It's a whole game or nothing.

"I don't really get warmed up until I'm into the second half," he said. "Anything else than the regulation eighteen holes I would not consider a game at all."

Since the judge never would consent to meet an adversary, however, distinguished, for less than eighteen holes, and John D. is only a golf sprinter, anyhow with his nine holes, they won't come together.

SEE MURDER PICTURES. TRY TO KILL COMPANION

Almost Fatal Termination of a Visit to An Indiana Moving Picture Show.

EVANSVILLE, Ind., Jan. 23.—After seeing moving pictures in a vaudeville show, where Indians were represented killing white people, Laundry Bradley, aged 9, and George Huskey, aged 9, tried to kill Roy Berry, aged 6, with an ax.

They tied the Berry boy to a log in his father's stable and had a heavy ax raised and were going to cut off his head when another companion rushed into the house and informed the lad's mother. The mother reached the stable in time to throw herself on the boy's neck, in Pocahontas fashion and save his life.

The Berry boy was a willing victim, and said he would have let his companions kill him had not his mother arrived on the scene.

BEERLESS BANQUET COST OKLAHOMA ATTORNEY JOB

Five Barrels, Meant For Legislators, Seized, and Gov. Haskell Protested.

GUTHRIE, Ok., Jan. 23.—Because he was censured by Gov. C. N. Haskell for seizing five barrels of beer, purchased by Guthrie citizens for the banquet Tuesday night to members of the Legislature, Fred S. Caldwell has handed his written resignation to Haskell as state prohibition enforcement attorney.

When called on the carpet by Haskell, Caldwell defended his action as proper under the law. Haskell asked:

"Why couldn't you be liberal for one day?"

"Perhaps I had better resign, governor," replied Caldwell.

Haskell is said to have retorted: "Well, you can't hand it in any too quick for me," and Caldwell acted immediately.
