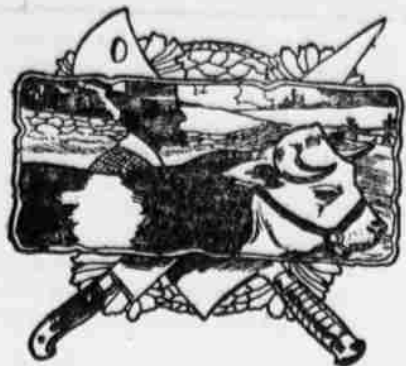

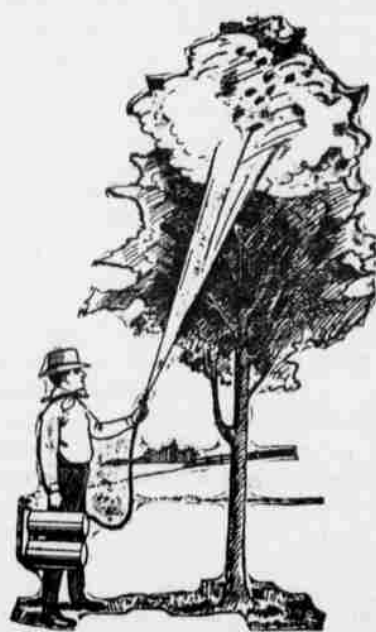

Fine Bungalow Completed.—One of the finest bungalows on Coos river has just been completed on the South Fork for Dr. Bartle of North Bend. It is situated just below Herbert Lockhart's summer home.

Must Clean Up.—Dr. E. Mingus, city health officer, and Marshal Carter will institute a clean up crusade. Everyone who does not get their yards and premises in good condition is liable to arrest and a fine if the officials find any flagrant violations.

Died in Boise.—The body of Lewis Lindsay, a son of Wm. Lindsay of Myrtle Point, passed through here yesterday en route to the parents' home. The young man who was about eighteen years old, died suddenly in Boise, Idaho, last Monday. The funeral will be held in Myrtle Point Sunday, probably.

Rumor Not Correct.—For several days, a rumor has been in circulation that the C. A. Smith Lumber and Manufacturing Company was planning to rebuild the old Bay City Hill or resume its operation soon. The company is figuring on ultimately doing this but the plans are such that the mill will not be put in operation for at least another year.
