## NEW RECORD BY NANN SMITH

Big Lumber Carrier Makes  
Phenomenal Trip Between  
Here and Bay Point.

The Nann Smith, the big lumber carrier of the C. A. Smith Lumber and Manufacturing company, reached Coos Bay early yesterday afternoon after breaking all records for the round trip run from Marshfield to San Francisco. She also broke her previous fast records of loading and unloading her big cargoes.

She reached Coos Bay Friday, March 5, from San Francisco and immediately repaired to her slip at the mill and loaded, over 1,600,000 feet of lumber was loaded in less than thirty-six hours and she crossed out over the Coos Bay bar Sunday, about forty-eight hours after she had entered port. She proceeded to Bay Point, up the river from San Francisco, unloader her cargo, took on her supply of oil fuel and sailed for Coos Bay, reaching here shortly after noon yesterday, seven days after she had crossed in first and within less than five days of the time she had started for Bay Point.

General Manager J. E. Oren, Capt. B. H. Olson and C. A. Smith personally are elated over the records made, a speed that they had scarcely hoped to attain so soon.

In this connection, it is announced that the Nann Smith will soon be registered from Marshfield. At present she is registered from Minneapolis owing to the headquarters of the holding company having been located there when she was first built and registered.
