THE EUGENE Register pays the following tribute to Coos Bay for its action at the recent Port Bill election:

"The Coos Bay country is wise. By an overwhelming majority of 894 to 162 yeas, or about six to one, the Port of Coos Bay bill was carried which permits that section to bond itself for harbor improvement. This is the same proposition that the Siuslaw country votes on next month. It means much to Coos Bay and is equally important to the Siuslaw. If the Siuslaw falls to carry the measure, Coos Bay will have the best of the coast situation; but Siuslaw is certainly awake to its interests and will carry the proposition by a good, strong majority."
