

## DIFFER OVER STREET WIDTH

Owing to Plat Being Indefinite,  
Railroad Avenue May Be  
Reduced in Width.

How wide should Railroad avenue be? This is the question that is perplexing the city officials just now. The thoroughfare has not been open for travel hitherto but it will soon be available as a highway as a result of the section of Railroad Addition through which it runs, being filled by the dredge Oregon. All the other streets in Railroad Addition are seventy-five and eighty feet wide, the north and south streets being eighty feet wide and the east and west thoroughfares seventy-five feet. Railroad avenue however runs at an angle to these and owing to the notations on the map not showing its width clearly, it is claimed that the eighty-foot measurement of the streets it connects leaves Railroad avenue only seventy-one and a fraction feet wide. City Engineer Sandberg insists that it must be either seventy-five or eighty feet wide while the Railroad Company and some of the abutting property owners who will own the land not taken in the street, say it is only seventy-one and a fraction feet.

The matter would have probably been thrashed out at the meeting of the city council to have been held Tuesday if there had been a quorum present. President Savage was in Coquille doing jury duty and Mayor Straw is in California. Councilmen Nelson, Albrecht and Coke met at the council chamber but could only informally discuss matters. The question of the grade of Broadway was also to have been settled, the property owners maintaining that the fill and planking as now being put in are not up to the grade established by the city.

Within a few days, all of the old warrants issued by the city of Marshfield prior to November 6, 1906, will be redeemed by City Treasurer Williams. He has on hand \$6,405.83 of tax money and \$486.25 of money diverted from old street improvements as the cost of engineering, etc., for this purpose. As all the tax money collected this year will be used to redeem old warrants, City Recorder Butler believes that by the end of the year all general fund warrants issued prior to January 1, 1907, will be taken up. It has not been definitely determined whether the city's income this year will meet the current expenses, but it is not believed that it will, so while the length of time that the city's warrants have been outstanding will be reduced, the volume of outstanding warrants at the end of the year will probably be greater than at present.

### TAKE UP AGREEMENT.

## PAY TRIBUTE TO L'ENFANT

Unusual Honors In Memory of  
Famous Frenchman Who  
Laid Out Washington.

(By Associated Press.)

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 28.—Unusual honors were paid today to the memory of Major Pierce Charles L. L'Enfant, the famous French engineer who, under the authority of George Washington, laid out the city of Washington. His body was disinterred from its resting place in the Digges' farm in Maryland where he was buried in 1825, and taken to the capitol under a military escort today. In the rotunda where the body lay in state, ceremonies were held at which Vice-president Sherman and Ambassador Jusserand of France, paid tribute to the noted Frenchman. This afternoon, the body was taken to the Arlington National cemetery where religious services will be held.

President Taft, Vice-president Sherman and numerous senators were among the early arrivals. President Taft was there as a spectator.
