

COQUILLE PORT ELECTION SOON

Petitions For Organization of District Will Be Circulated Shortly.

COQUILLE, Ore., April 30.—At a meeting of representatives of the commercial bodies of Coquille, Bandon and Myrtle Point, in Coquille it was decided to take steps at once for the establishment of a Port of Coquille river. Judge Sperry, of Coquille, was authorized to draw up a petition to be signed by the voters and presented to Judge Hall, requesting him to call a special election to vote on the port. This will be done at once and the election will be held soon. That it will go in favor of the port is assured, as most of the voters in the valley have expressed themselves as favorable, and enthusiasm is getting higher all the time. Orville Dodge, of Myrtle Point, has been appointed to collect data to be furnished to the proper authorities regarding the amount of commerce in and out of the river during the past year and also to ascertain an estimate of the future commerce, providing the river and harbor is put in proper condition. The fact that the Port of Coos Bay carried by such an overwhelming majority has added enthusiasm to the Coquille project.

FIND MANY BEAVERS.

Drain Men Make Discovery On Smith River Trip.

The Drain Nonpareil says: "Ed. Renie, Geo. Ellenberg and Osborne Gunter have just returned from a rather perilous trip which they made down Smith river from Gunter to Gardiner, a distance of about 75 miles, in a canoe. Mr. Renie had a contract to furnish logs to the Gardiner Mill Co., and the object of the trip was to disgorge some logs which had "stopped to rest" on the way down the river. They spent 12 days in making the trip, and had doodles of fun hunting and fishing. They encountered a number of beaver camp on the trip, and brought back several saplings, which the razor-toothed beavers cut down and scalped the bark as "sick as a whistle."

MAIL TO ALASKA.

PORTLAND, April 30. — Alaska's winter deadlock is broken. Steamer transportation to the Yukon will be possible after May 10. Mails that have been held up many months awaiting the time when it would be possible to make deliveries will be sent out of Seattle by the steamer Corwin on May 10, reads a bulletin sent the local railway mail division by A. J. Lashe third assistant postmaster general. The acceptance of registered letters and packages is authorized in the same bulletin. It has been many months since registered mail for interior Alaska has been accepted.
