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MORE TROUBLE OVER STREETS

Tract Thought to Be Part of Sixth Street Claimed As Private Property.

The question of the ownership of Sixth street or rather the north end of what was supposed to be Sixth street although it had not been formally opened for travel, will probably be brought up by the city council tonight. The question of ownership has just been raised by the C. A. Smith Company fencing off the tract, generally supposed to be the street, as private property.

W. J. Conrad of the land department of the C. A. Smith Company, says that he has examined the records closely and he cannot find that it was ever dedicated to the city by the E. B. Dean Company and consequently it belongs to the C. A. Smith Company which acquired the Dean Company property here.

The tract lies just south of Central avenue and the building of the fence around has attracted considerable attention, although few are aware that the new fence signifies the claiming of it as private property.

While there are no buildings on the flat that require Sixth street to be opened through now, it was the intention to have it opened soon as it would improve the means of travel to South Marshfield.

HAINS TO SING SING.

Murderer of Wm. E. Annis Taken to Prison.

(By Associated Press.) NEW YORK, May 18.—Capt. Peter Hains, Jr., who was sentenced yesterday on conviction of manslaughter for killing Wm. E. Annis, left the Queen's county jail today for Sing Sing prison to begin a term of from eight to sixteen years.

Engineer L. Young, counsel for Hains, said no application would be made for a certificate of reasonable doubt but that an appeal in Capt. Hains' behalf would be taken to the higher courts in the regular way.
