New Fish and Game Laws to Change Conditions Entirely

GO INTO EFFECT MAY 25, AND ONLY EXCEPTIONS ARE MEASURES PASSED AT SPECIAL SESSION — LICENSE REQUIRED TO BE TAKEN OUT BY FISHERMEN.

The new game and fish laws, passed at the last session of the legislature, take effect May 25. The only exceptions to this are those laws passed at the special session, which take effect nine days later. The result of the new laws is an entire change in conditions under which hunters and anglers may hunt and fish. For instance, the bag limit for ducks was formerly 50 in one week. Now it is 35 in a week. The limit placed on the hunting of upland birds used to be 10 in a day. Now the limit placed on sage hens and cocks, quail and prairie chickens, as well as other upland birds, is five in a day or 10 in a week.

The new laws also provide a closed season for trout and change the length of the open season for game. Anglers could formerly fish without a license. Now a license is required, the fee being \$1.

Abstract of game and fish laws, 1909-10, arranged by H. G. Schneider, Portland, Ore., and copyrighted by Mann & Beach, printers, Portland, Ore.:

Bag Limit.
Sage hen and cocks, 5 in one day or 10 in a week; quail 5 in one day or 10 in one week; prairie chickens, 5 in one day or 10 in one week; other upland birds, 5 in one day or 10 in one week; ducks, 35 in one week; geese and swan, no limit; deer, 5 in one season.

Catch Limit.
Trout, 75 in one day (except Klamath county); trout, Klamath county, 25 in one day or equal to 20 pounds; bass and salmon trout, no limit; bass and salmon trout, open all year.

Buck deer, except in Baker, Grant, Harney, Malheur, Umatilla, Union and Wallawa.

Buck deer, in counties named above.

Silver-gray squirrel.

Chinese pheasants, males only.

Native pheasants and grouse, except as below.

Native pheasants and grouse, in Union, Wallawa, Baker, Umatilla, Grant.

Prairie chickens, killing in Grant, Harney and Umatilla prohibited.

Sage hen and sage cock.

Quail, except as below.

Quail, in Jackson and Josephine.

Doves or wild pigeons.

Ducks, in Multnomah, Columbia and Clatsop. (In counties not named, open season, October 1 to February 15.)

Ducks, Harney, Malheur, Morrow, Umatilla, Wallawa, Union, Baker and Grant.

Ducks, Coos, Curry and Lake. (Except in Klamath, open season September 1 to February 1.)

Geese and swan, in Harney, Baker, Union, Wallawa, Sherman, Gilliam, Grant, Klamath, Malheur and Lake.

Honker geese, in Grant, Harney and Malheur.

Shore and wading birds, bag limit 50 in one week.

Trout (except as below), open season April 1 to November 1.

Trout in Baker county, from the lakes thereof.

Trout, in Link river, Klamath county. (In Rogue river and tributaries, open all year.)

What Is Always Unlawful.
To sell, offer for sale, barter or exchange, ship, carried or transported beyond the boundaries of this state, any deer, moose, mountain sheep, elk, silver-gray squirrel, swan, prairie chicken, grouse and all species of upland birds and ducks.

To hunt without a license.
To hunt or kill any mountain sheep or antelope.
To hunt or kill any elk until August 1, 1919.
To kill beaver any age, or deer less than one year old.
To run deer with dogs or night hunting.
To kill China pheasants in Jackson, Josephine, Hood River or Malheur.
To kill female deer at any time, or to mutilate carcass so as to disguise sex.
To hunt or kill any silver, golden, copper, Japanese or Reeves pheasants, English or Hungarian partridge or Bob White quail.
To kill quail or Mongolian pheasants in Grant, Harney, Gilliam, Umatilla, Wheeler, Morrow and Malheur until October 15, 1913.
To trap or destroy nests of protected game birds.
To operate any sink box, sink or sneak boat, skiff or launch, except

in the Willamette river, above Oregon City, and in Yaquina and Coos Bay.

To hunt with batteries swivel gun, fire, flashlight or blinds more than 100 feet from shore, except on land owned by hunter.

To shoot on inclosed land without permission.

To ship or sell deer skins without being properly tagged.

To fish without a license.

To fish at night or one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise, except within tide waters of the Coquille river.

To sell trout except those propagated in private fish hatcheries, then under the directions of the State Game Warden.

To take trout, salmon trout or bass, except with hook and line.

To take trout chair or salmon less than six inches.

To use powder, gas, lime, cocculus indicus poison, etc., in any lake, river, stream, pond, bay or other waters within the boundaries of this state.

To cast sawdust, planer shavings, lumber waste, wood pulp, etc., in any stream of this state.

Penalties.
Fine to transport game outside of this state, etc., \$100 to \$500 and imprisonment.

Violation of game laws, \$15 to \$500.

Fine to hunt without a license, \$25 to \$100 and imprisonment.

Fine to fish without a license, \$25 to \$150.

Fine for violation of any of the fish laws, \$25 to \$150.

Fine for the use of powder, gas, lime, etc., in any of the streams of this state, \$200 to \$3,000.

Note—Ducks can be sold from November 15 to December 15.

For deer tags apply to any Justice of Peace or County Clerk.

Hunter's and angler's license good anywhere in Oregon.

**LANDS BIG STRING;
LIVER HIS BAIT**

GILLSBURG, Pa., May 22. — An unusual trout story was brought here by Bill Boyd who had been spending several days fishing in Spruce Run. At first his tale was received with doubt, but when Mr. Boyd exhibited twenty-eight fish, all of them more than fifteen inches in length, he received a respectful hearing.

"I learned from trustworthy authority," said Mr. Boyd, "that a number of fine trout had been placed in the run about four years ago. Although the stream had been fished repeatedly and by experts, few of these trout, which were of the California variety, had been caught. Indeed, it was feared by some that the fish had all died."

"In walking along the run I caught sight of many big fish, but I could not catch them. They refused to rise to the ordinary flies, and they would have nothing to do with worms."

"Along about noon I built a fire on the bank of the stream, and, getting out my saucer, I proceeded to fry some liver and bacon. A commotion in the water attracted my attention. I looked down and saw the run alive with the finest trout I ever beheld. Then I understood. Those trout had been raised on liver, and they recognized the odor. I used my fried liver for bait — and here is the result."
