nature of an aristocratic Republic but the rolling years has seen it taken from the exclusive class and delivered to all the people. If the people of our democratic Republic do not now rule it is not because they do not possess the right to do so or because they lack the power but because they do not now choose to exercise the right or the power, and if the chance which has been effected, in attempting to realize the ideal of the fathers is not complete, there are evidences on every side that we are still progressing, for some states, and we feel proud to claim Oregon as the foremost among them, have adopted the initiative and referendum for the purpose of keeping the government close to the people. We are marching on and as we march we keep always in view those words of life and light; "all men are created equal."

At the close of the revolutionary war the constitution which our fathers adopted carefully preserved all forms of property without much regard to the rights of man. Vested rights were protected at all hazards and the result was that all classes were satisfied for the time being. But the ideal of humanity was still shining from its immortal heights and its rays were penetrating the dark regions of superstition and custom. What had been considered practical and right was found to be morally and economically wrong. Always true to the great ideal Americans arose from their indifference of a system of oppression and washed away with the blood of a million heroes the reproach and stain of chattel slavery. Today the stars and stripes wave above a nation under whose laws no man can be held in servitude by another. We honor our fathers and glorify the deeds of those heroes who offered their lives to advance their country's standard

ment. She said at last to her own people, to Canada, Australia and New Zealand and to Ireland which had suffered at her hands for centuries: "All men are created equal."

The result of the revolutionary war was the vindication of the nation's ideal. The result of the civil war was to make the ideal more of a reality. Since then the American people have sustained the highest hopes and the most exalted expectations of those who founded this nation. In 1898, there was waged between this country and Spain a war whose purpose was neither conquest, commerce nor superstition. Was ever such a conflict on this earth before. For the sake of oppressed humanity the stars and stripes were carried into Cuba, Porto Rico and the Philippine dependencies of Spain. Some chose to call the action of the government: Imperialism. Whatever name may be applied to such action, all men know that the war was a consequence of the practically unanimous demand of the people of the great republic and could not be avoided. The seed planted in the hearts of the people by that declaration had produced a spirit which would not tolerate the repetition of scenes and acts which would have been regarded as barbarous in the middle ages. What our fathers uttered as a truism which they scarcely regarded as practical in a commercial age, we, their children accepted as a truth and Cuba is free, Porto Rico is part of a free nation and the Philippine Islands will be free because our fathers declared and we believe that "all men are created equal."

All the truly great movements for the improvement of the human race seem to spring from the most humble conditions. They come as a surprise and are received with contempt. The world does not expect anything good to come out of Nazareth. This declaration of independence was neither looked upon as important nor were the American colonies considered worthy of much notice. England thought to suppress the rebellion in a few weeks and perhaps days. She did not realize that truth has a strength of its own and that one with God is a majority. The American colonies had a population so sparse that it may be correctly said that no part of the present nation is so thinly settled as were most of the colonies at that time. Scarcely three million inhabitants could be counted scattered along the narrow seaboard and west of the Appalachian mountains was merely a vast unbroken wilderness.

But the waiting millions of Europe were watching for the star of freedom and when they saw it rise at last in the form of a Republic with an ideal which guaranteed to all the enjoyment of man's unalienable rights and whose ideal was the equality of all men, they came to these shores and filled the land with the music of their prosperity. Where the fathers were hardly strong enough to assert equality and man's unalienable right to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness, the ninety million who now possess the land they fought to free are powerful to enforce the practice.

The influence of the declaration cannot be measured. It has gone forth and filled the world with its great awakening light. It has not produced a paradise or a Utopia all at once, but it has gone on its way into every land and has shed its light in some degree into every home on earth. Revolutionary France, with its wild, weird song of liberty "The Marseillaise," was the first to see the light. It came to the people of that politically benighted country with an influence which dazzled and, perhaps, blinded them for a time. But, years have passed and the corrupt kingdom of Louis XVI, the tumult and riot of Robespierre and the imperial splendor of Napoleon have been succeeded by the Republic of France, founded on the declaration by our American fathers of that self evident truth "all men are created equal."

The nations of Europe whose absolute monarchs frowned on every struggle which mankind made for liberty, insisted on parliamentary representation and looking across the Atlantic saw the people whom their systems had rejected wax strong and become prosperous and wise. They, too, raised their voices in harmony with the universal acclamation and swelled the mighty chorus which grows grander each succeeding year with the great truth of the declaration that "all men are created equal."

Truth is always new when it enters the intelligence which knew it not before but truth is eternal and in itself it knows neither change nor limitation of time. When it came through the declaration into the intelligence of man there was no chance of its being again limited. It had to develop until at last it should reach the farthest and most benighted regions, and the great truth with which we are dealing and which is the ideal of the American Republic has been attended with such advantages to those who have accepted it that its virtue is now apparent to the most obtuse. Far off on the steppes of Russia, where the serf has received emancipation, where the knout has been abolished and the Cossack has not been able to prevent the assemblage of a parliamentary body which suggests the coming freedom of Russia, the great truth that "all men are created equal" has taken hold of the people.

In Turkey, the land of the Mohammedan and the Koran, where the Sultan's will has been absolute until a few weeks ago, the Young Turks have accepted the principle of manhood equality and have thrown the Sultan and despotism into oblivion. The same remarkable revolution is taking place in distant Persia and the will of the people is being substituted for the will of a tyrant, while Japan, accepting the civilization of Europe has developed a power which could be developed, in this age, on no other basis. Even in China the sleeping giant is being awakened to hear the glad truth that "all men are created equal."

Thus it is, fellow citizens, that the declaration of independence has become the most powerful influence for good since the Nazarene went about doing good and preaching the gospel of brotherly love.

Let us rejoice that we live in this age when so many million men and women understand that the endurance of the Republic and the strength of the nation rest on that rock of truth the equality of man.

It may be true that the differences between men still seem to be very great and that we are still far from realizing the ideal which our fathers conceived, but the cause is marching on. It cannot fail. It cannot turn back. Sometimes it seems as if the vast accumulations of wealth in the hands of a few are a menace to our institutions and to our liberties, but as long as our Republic has so exalted an ideal as the declaration of independence affords us and that ideal grows brighter as all the events of American history show that it has done, there is nothing to fear.

Wealth and the power of wealth fade and vanish, but truth and the power of truth are unchangeable and invincible.

"Mine eyes have seen the glory of the coming of the Lord
He is trampling out the vintage where the grapes of wrath are stored;
He hath loosed the fateful lightning of his terrible swift sword:
His truth is marching on."

"He has sounded forth the trumpet that shall never call retreat,
He is sitting out the hearts of men before his judgment seat,
Oh! be swift, my soul, to answer Him! be jubilant my feet!
Our cause is marching on."

"In the beauty of the lilies Christ was born across the sea,
With a glory in his bosom that transfigures you and me,
As he died to make men holy, let us live to make men free
While truth is marching on."
