BOUTS AT BANDON.

Two Glove Contests Pulled Off In City-By-the-Sea.

The Bandon Recorder says: "The boxing contest at Oriental hall, Monday afternoon proved a big drawing card. The preliminary was fought between Kid Parsons of Marshfield and Charlie Conrad of Bandon, and the main bout was between Martin Kennedy of Bandon and Earl Chism of Coquille.

WANT AID FOR ROAD.

Bandon Sends Delegation to County Court.

The Bandon Recorder says: "A party of business men composed of A. McNair, M. Breuer, Steve Gallier, R. H. Rosa, J. C. Shields, Chris Rasmussen and O. A. Trowbridge went to Coquille Wednesday to insist on the county court sticking to the proposition of paying dollar for dollar into this road district for all the extra money that could be raised for improving roads.
