#### TO DREDGE THE BAR.

G. A. BENNETT WHO knows more probably about Coos Bay harbor and bar than any other man with the possible exception of Capt. Magee, has the following to say in reference to Major McIndoe's scheme for dredging the bar:

"It is too bad that Major McIndoe has decided to use a sea-going dredge in the improvement of the Coos Bay bar. Where the tides ebb and flow, and the sand is constantly being moved by wave action, the hole dug by a dredge on the bar would fill up before the dredge could take its load to sea and return. The jetty system has accomplished wonders for the bar, and why it should be discontinued for a new project, which proved a failure on the Columbia river, is more than we can understand. The sum of \$350,000 is recommended for building the dredge and operating the same. The much greater portion of this sum will be necessary for the construction of the dredge, but there will be enough of the appropriation left to prove the project a failure, and then the dredge will be taken to some other place to do harbor work. Coos Bay will be charged up with the appropriation, and when we again ask for deeper water on the bar we will be told that a large sum was lately spent in a futile effort to attain that end, and that our commercial importance doesn't justify any further expenditure at present.

There will be no chance to divert this appropriation to maintaining the present jetty, because it will be granted for the specific purpose of building and operating a sea-going dredge. Under the circumstances it would be much better to get no appropriation at all for bar improvement than to be granted one which restricts its use to an experiment, the failure of which is a foregone conclusion.

If this \$350,000 was recommended to aid in building up to high water mark the sunken portion of the jetty near the bar, a great deal of benefit would be derived. It is over this sunken jetty that the ocean currents carry the sand into the bar channel and cause the bar to shoal. Build the jetty up to high water mark and make it permanent, thus perfecting the channel from the drifting sand, and the work accomplished heretofore is a guarantee that a depth of 30 feet at low water can be maintained at all times.

There is no bar on the coast that can be made to accommodate the largest merchant vessels at such a comparatively trifling cost as the Coos Bay bar. Statements of this nature have been made at various times by prominent government engineers, and all of them favored the jetty system to accomplish that end. The present half-constructed jetty has maintained (according to the government figures) a depth at low water of from 20 to 22 feet on the crest of the bar. Then why, when the jetty has proved such a grand success, should it be abandoned and recommendations made to spend \$350,000 in trying to dig a well in quicksand?"

Mr. Bennett speaks with a knowledge born of years of study and observation of local conditions and his words should carry weight. This is a subject that should be taken up promptly by the Chambers of Commerce and other public bodies on the Bay.
