THE CITY BEAUTIFUL.

THE COST OF A city beautiful is something enormous, but, aside from the education and inspiration it affords its residents, Paris has demonstrated that it pays. How much the public improvements in Paris had cost up to the time of the second empire no one knows, but it was many millions. Under Baron Eugene Haussmann's direction Napoleon III spent \$500,000,000 to make Paris the most beautiful city in the world, and additional expenditures have been made on no mean scale ever since, says an exchange. Now it is proposed to spend \$135,000,000 more in carrying out a systematic plan of beautification, the municipal council having already approved the plans and appropriated the money. Under Boss Shepherd millions were expended to make Washington beautiful and symmetrical, and it is now far in advance of other American cities. New York has expended enormous sums for municipal beautification, but its business district is so out of harmony that it cannot be compared to Paris and Berlin in this respect. Our new and growing cities of the West can hardly afford to spend such vast sums for beautification, but they certainly can avoid the mistakes in city-making which render beautification in the future either impossible or excessively costly.
