He believes in the value of vacations, but he deplores the idea embraced by the average business man in this country that he can abuse his system for fifty weeks out of the year, providing he is able to secure a rest during the remaining two weeks.

It is true that we look upon our vacations as the annual relief of all our mental and physical troubles. The man who is feeling out of sorts, who is overworking or failing to take sufficient physical exercise or mental recreation is inclined to the theory that all will be well as soon as summer comes and he can go away some place and relax for a couple of weeks. He does not realize that nature requires time to repair bodily and mental ills. If it were not for the knowledge that he can take a vacation once a year, the average man would make a greater effort to conserve his energies through all the months.

Men should not depend altogether upon the arbitrary period of rest in the summertime for the restoration of their flagging strength. They should so live that their strength would not flag. They should not expect to liquidate the debt to nature in two weeks or a month. The accounts should be settled from day to day. They should relax at the end of every working day and get themselves into shape for the next day's work. Men should look upon their summer vacation as a pleasure and not a necessity.
