Notice is hereby given, by order of the Common Council of the City of Marshfield, Coos County, Oregon, dated the 24th day of June, 1909, that a special election will be held at the City Hall in the City of Marshfield, Coos County, Oregon, between the hours of 9 o'clock a. m., and 6 o'clock p. m., on TUESDAY the 24th, day of August, 1909, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said City for their approval or rejection, an amendment to Section 110 of the city Charter of said City of Marshfield, to increase the limit of indebtedness to five per cent of the assessed valuation of the property within the corporate limits of the said city, and also an amendment to sub-division 34 of Section 28 of the Charter of the said City of Marshfield, authorizing and empowering the Common Council of the City of Marshfield, to issue and dispose of bonds of said city, not exceeding five per cent of the assessed valuation of the property within the corporate limits of said City of Marshfield, said bonds to be payable in not less than ten nor more than twenty years, the same to bear interest not exceeding six per cent, for the purpose of redeeming and paying off the warrant indebtedness of the said City of Marshfield, Coos County, Oregon.
