

# ENDEAVOR TO BURN PLANT

### Strikers' Attempt to Fire Pennsylvania Factory Foiled By Guards.

(By Associated Press.)  
PITTSBURG, Aug. 20.—Early today an attempt was made by unknown persons to start a fire inside the plant of the Pressed Steel Car Company. Several large bundles of burning excelsior were thrown over the fence but were extinguished by the guards. Because of threats to blow up the ferry steamer used to carry employes to the works, the crew of the boat quit today.

### MANY FROM PORTLAND.

**Large Delegation of Business Men Come Here.**  
Wednesday's Portland Telegram says: "Coos Bay is going to have more Portland business men within its borders this week than ever it knew at one time before. The steamer Breakwater, which leaves for Coos Bay this evening at 8 o'clock, has a full complement of passengers, mostly made up of delegates from this city to the sessions of the Oregon-Idaho Development League, which meets at Marshfield.  
"Coos Bay, like Central Oregon, is crying loudly for rail communication with the outside world, and the function of the Oregon-Idaho Development League is to bring her needs before the eyes of the railroad builders of the country. It is now conceded that Jim Hill's building into Central Oregon was brought about by the publicity given the dire needs of a rich country through the newspapers of Oregon, in conjunction with the commercial bodies of the city and state, and these bodies will not desert from their efforts until the large and rich territory along the Oregon coast can send its products to market by rail and can obtain its supplies in the same manner. The meetings at this time in the important towns around Coos Bay are expected to do more to bring direct communication about than anything that has been so far attempted.  
"The Portland Chamber of Commerce is to be represented by a social committee composed of W. B. Glafke, C. S. Jackson, G. W. Cornwall, H. R. Lewis and Charles Deyette."

### SURVEY NEARS END.

**Government Engineers at Work On the Coquille.**

COQUILLE, Ore., Aug. 21.—The crew of government engineers which has been surveying the Coquille for a new rivers and harbors project have reached a point near Randolph in the Rocky Point neighborhood. The survey was begun at Myrtle Point about two weeks ago and has been pushed as rapidly as thoroughness would permit with the result that the work will no doubt be completed within a few days.

The river will be sounded through its length from Myrtle Point to Bandon, the width of the channel measured and a map of the entire river for that distance will be drawn by the engineers. The work is being done under the supervision of Assistant Engineer Carroll who has been working a crew of eight men for the past two weeks. The work is very arduous and requires the greatest care and accuracy. One gasoline boat and two skiffs are used by the crew.

Should a new project be given on the Coquille it will, without a doubt, include the dredging and snagging of the entire river from Myrtle Point to the sea and also the deepening, in some permanent manner, of the bar at Bandon.
