THE NORTHWESTERN FOR COOS BAY:

THE NEWS with regard to the Northwestern and New York Central Railroads in today's paper may be very interesting to Coos Bay people if they understand it. Reference is made to the article which shows that Harriman or Southern Pacific interests, no longer control the New York Central or the Chicago and Northwestern, but that Marvin Hughitt, president of the Chicago & Northwestern, is independent of those interests. This will be a source of great satisfaction to those who have been expecting the Chicago & Northwestern, now having a terminal at Lander, Wyo., to come west to the coast. It is known that President Marvin Hughitt has always been anxious to push his line west and that he has his eyes on no less a place than Coos Bay. Prior to 1907, there was a strong prospect that Coos Bay was to be the Western terminus of the Northwestern line and it was thought that the Southern Pacific ordered the construction of the Drain line to preserve its traffic advantage against that system. But the influence of Harriman and Frick placed Harriman on the Board of Directors of the Northwestern and stopped the construction of the Northwestern west of Lander, Wyoming, and the Drain line to Coos Bay. All west bound traffic of the Northwestern went over the Union Pacific and the threat to open a new seaport on the Pacific was not carried out.

Whether the change, which restores the Northwestern and New York Central to the Vanderbilts and their able President Hughitt, will result in the extension of the road from Lander, Wyo., to Coos Bay is not known to the layman, but it is certain that the situation has become acute so far as the South Pacific is concerned. Evidently that company regards the railroad movement in the direction of Roseburg with apprehension and The Times has reason to believe that an announcement will soon be made that construction will be resumed on the Drain road to meet the expected competition. The people of Coos Bay may be sure that, while the Northwestern may not be the first railroad to be in operation between this port and the outside world, it is the road whose probable advent will compel the building of the first road. The important thing is to place a solid support behind the Coos Bay and Boise Railroad which is now being surveyed between Coos Bay and Roseburg. Give it a moral support and such other support as may seem best.
