NO FLAW IN LOCAL PORT

Port of Coos Bay Commission
Declares That Proposed
Attack is Unfounded.

C. R. Peck, attorney for the Port of Coos Bay, stated today that there was absolutely no ground to support the contention that the organization of the port here was defective and void. He stated that even if Governor Chamberlain had neglected to sign the bill with the emergency clause attached, the state law provides that it shall become a law in five days if not vetoed by the executive. In this, Mr. Peck is supported by Senator Chase of Coquille, who was called up this morning by phone. He said that it was the custom of the governor to merely file the measures passed by the General Assembly and allow them to become laws. He said that of all the measures passed by the last general assembly, only about a dozen were signed by the governor.

Mr. Peck said that the matter was not giving him any uneasiness, and when the proper time came that he would be glad to meet in the courts any issue that might be raised along the lines suggested.

Henry Sengstacken, secretary of the Port Commission, today gave out the following statement concerning the matter:

"Yes, the Port Commission notified the statement of The Times last evening, in fact we have known for some time that Mr. Bennett contemplated an attack upon the Commission under cover of the cloak of an attorney for the Southern Oregon Company. We are not worrying about the outcome of any suit that

he may file. Whether the governor actually signed the bill or not is immaterial, we know that he filed the bill with the Secretary of the State which is the customary act of approval, and the bill without his signature became a law in five days from the time it was presented to him. But these facts are well-known and the purpose of this fight at this time is to bring a skeleton out of the closet which will scare away bond buyers and prevent the sale of the bonds.

"I am sorry that any Coos Bay citizen should take this attitude, state effect, but because of its future effect. This is in reality an attack upon the credit of this community and will react against us for a long time to come. Every bond issue that the Port may attempt to float for years to come will be given a black eye and sell at a reduced price, if the present efforts should be successful as suggested in last evening's paper. If any person has a personal fight on the Commission, it should be made under the "recall" provision of the Constitution which would not hurt the community, and would give vent to the satisfaction of personal enmity. But in conducting a personal fight against the Commission by way of fighting the credit of the Port creates a condition which hurts every interest on the Bay."
