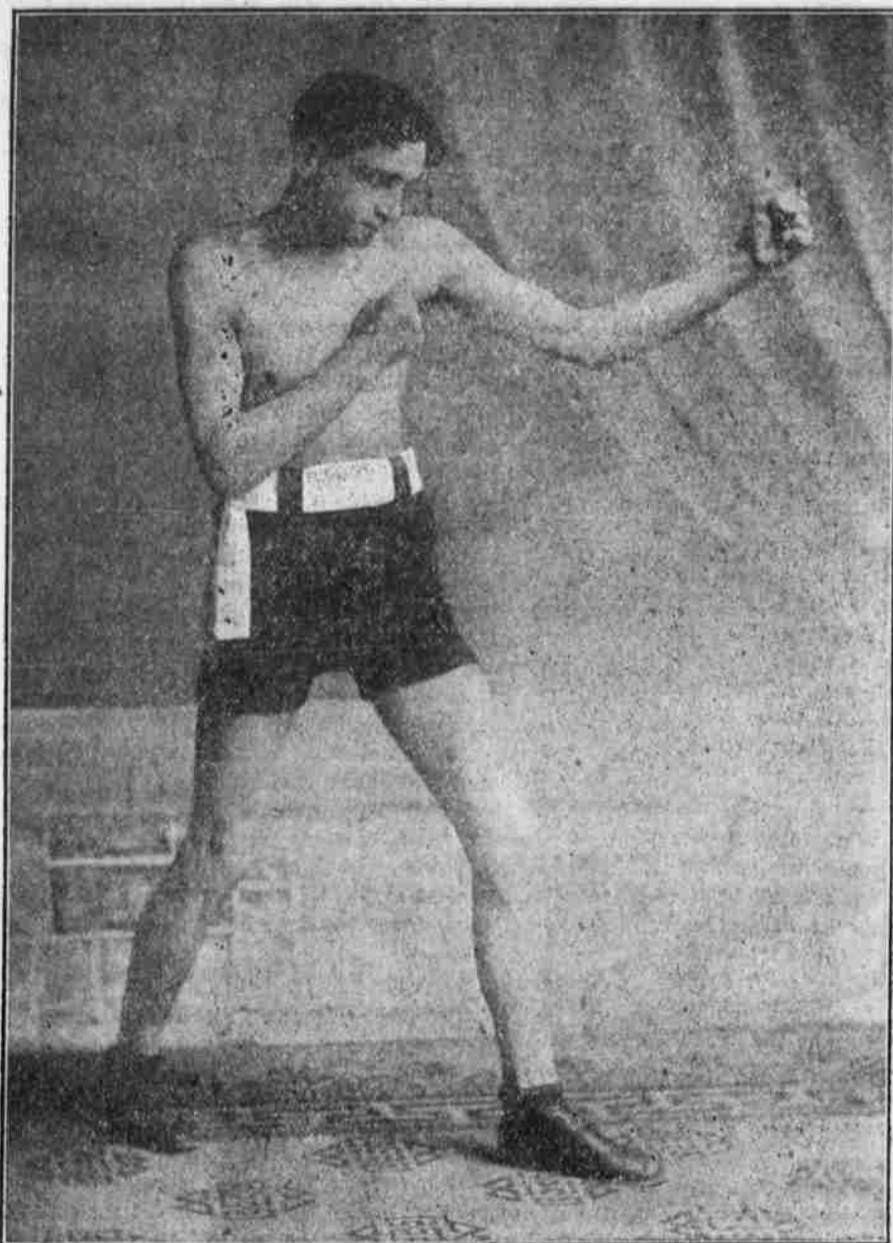
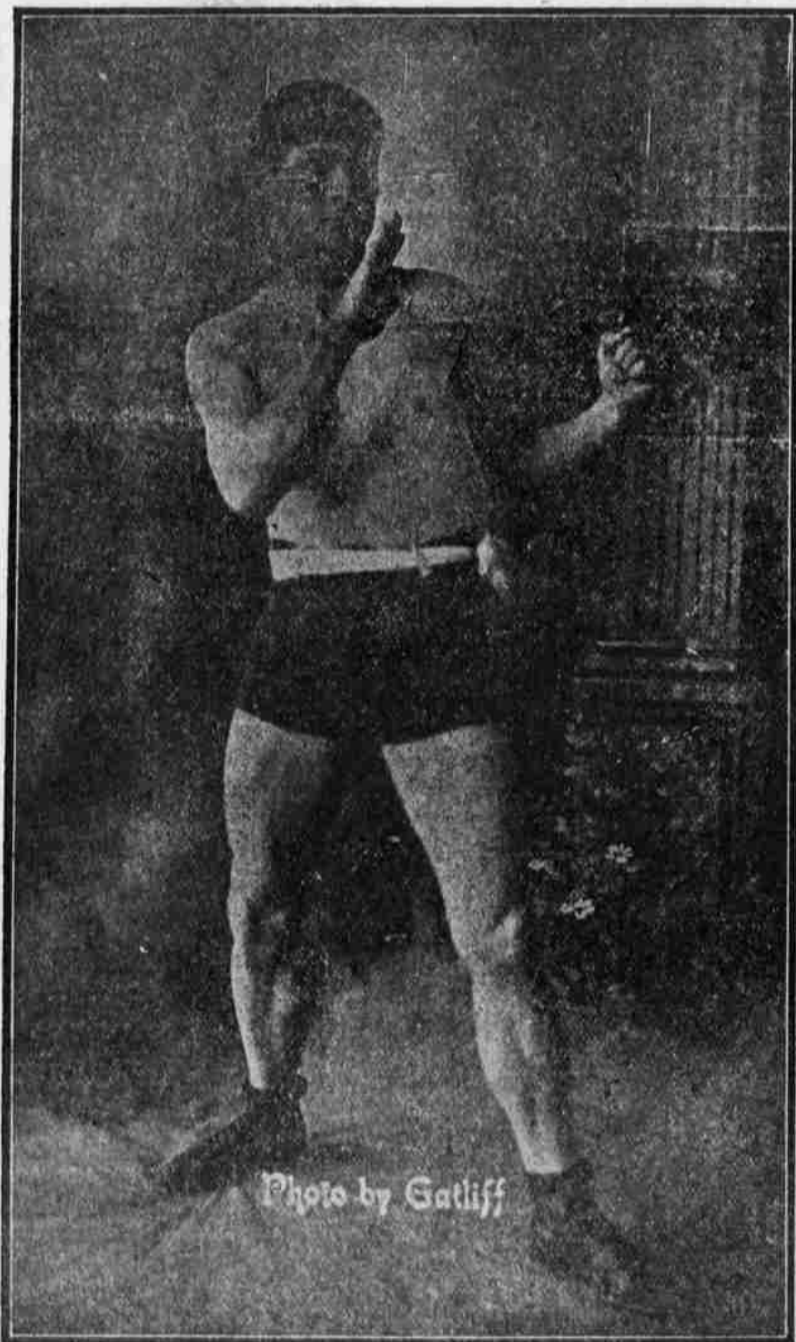


BOXERS MEET HERE SATURDAY NIGHT

More interest has been aroused by the Sax-Dougherty bout, scheduled for next Saturday night at the Marshfield Skating rink than in any boxing match that has been pulled off on the Bay in a long time. Both come highly recommended and their reputations are about a standoff and each is determined to win.

Manager John Herron, who brought the pair together here, is enthusiastic over the prospects. He says it will afford Coos Bay sports one of the classiest events they have seen in many a day. Owing to Mr. Herron's success with previous bouts, his promise is to be relied upon. As a further guarantee, he has checks printed on each ticket entitling each man to his money back in case the bout fails.

The bout is to be for twenty rounds at 150 pounds. P. L. Phelan of Myrtle Point, will probably referee. A classy preliminary is also being arranged.

Sax is training at Coquille and has won many backers in the Valley by his clever work. Arrangements have been made to run a special train here from Coquille for the bout. The special will leave Coquille about 7 o'clock in the evening and will leave Marshfield on the return trip shortly after midnight. It is expected that about two hundred will come over from the Valley.

Dougherty is training in the Athletic Club's rooms over the postoffice. Every afternoon at 3 o'clock, the quarters are pretty well filled with onlookers to see him go through his stunts.

Tickets for the bout are now on sale at the Bell Cord saloon and the reserved seat tickets are going fast.

PORTLAND WANTS TRADE.

Ask For Bids.—Copies of the post-office department advertisement for bids for carrying the mail between Myrtle Point and Marshfield on Sundays from December 14 to June 30, 1910, reached here this morning. Six hours is allowed for the trip each way. This will enable bids to be made for both stage and railway service.

MAIL SERVICE KICK.

Outgoing Pouches Lie Over In Roseburg Now.

The Myrtle Point Enterprise says: "Instead of lying over at this place for ten hours, the mail now lies over in Roseburg and not only the bay mail but all the mail going out of the county, and that of Curry county is affected."

"Mail leaving here at 11 o'clock in the morning, has 26 hours running time to Roseburg, which brings it in there at 1 o'clock the following day. The first mail train to the north leaves at 11:20 p. m. Thus the north bound mail is held at Roseburg for more than ten hours. The south bound mail train leaves Roseburg at 5 in the morning, and the mail for San Francisco is therefore held for about 15 hours. Under the old schedule when the stage left here at 8 in the evening, close connections were made with the north bound mail, while there were but a few hours delay with the south bound connections. Through this change not only is the bay mail held up, but the mail on every other route centering in Myrtle Point suffers like delay. The officials at Washington are evidently not cognizant of the situation or they would not have made such an order. The real remedy would have been to get the bay mail here to connect with the evening stage. This would have given the bay the outgoing service desired and would not have held up the Coquille Valley and Curry county mail."
