MAIL SERVICE KICK.

Outgoing Pouches Lie Over In Roseburg Now.

The Myrtle Point Enterprise says: 'Instead of lying over at this place for ten hours, the mail now lies over in Roseburg and not only the bay mail but all the mail going out of the county, and that of Curry county is affected.

"Mail leaving here at 11 o'clock in the morning, has 26 hours running time to Roseburg, which brings it in there at 1 o'clock the following day. The first mail train to the north leaves at 11:20 p. m. Thus the north bound mail is held at Roseburg for more than ten hours The south bound mail train leaves Roseburg at 5 in the morning, and the mail for San Francisco is therefore held for about 15 hours.
